## DECISION

Shadow Lake Corporation dba One Stop Market (the "Licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c.138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on September 28, 2010 regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c.138, §34C which occurred on July 22, 2010 according to Investigator Rose Egan-Bailey's Report.

- 3. Department of State Police Protective Custody Test Report Form;

## Facts

- 1. On July 22, 2010, members of the Haverhill Police Department conducted compliance checks in the City of Haverhill.
- 2. At approximately 8:28 p.m., an underage operative, working with the Haverhill Police Department, purchased a six-pack of Bud Light bottles for \$6.89 from Shadow Lake Corporation dba One Stop Market. The underage operative was not asked for identification.

## **Conclusion**

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. The Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which one (1) day will be served and two (2) will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur. ---- Formatted: Bullets and Numbering
