





HIP Incentives by Month







New HIP Households by Month

Healthy Incentives Program (HIP)	Eating fruits and vegetables each day is important for your health. HIP helps you buy more fruits and vegetables for your household.
	We automatically enroll SNAP households in HIP.
	Use your SNAP benefits at one of our HIP retailers to buy fruits and vegetables. You will receive \$20 for each dollar you spend on eligible fruits and vegetables, up to a monthly limit. Our HIP retailers include:

HIP Households with a recipient under the age of 18	Number of unique households with a recipient under the age of 18 since April 2017 divided by the number of HIP households since April 2017.
HIP Incentives by Month	Total amount of HIP incentives utilized within the month.
Average Incentives per Household	The total amount of HIP incentives utilized within the month divided by the Total HIP Households (within the month). The Average Incentives Per Household calculation has been updated on 3/22/2022 to reflect only households that earned HIP within the month. <i>(See the HIP Fact Sheet Data Excel file)</i>
New HIP Households	The number of new HIP households within the month that did not previously utilize HIP.
Total HIP Households	The cumulative unique number of households that have utilized HIP since April 2017. *This count was standardized in November 2023.

Percentage of HIP Households per County	Number of unique households that have utilized HIP in the current reporting month in each county divided by the total number of SNAP Households in the same month.
