#### **Interpreter Service Update**

Over the past few weeks, significant changes have been made to improve the 9-1-1 interpreter service. Please see below.

- There is no longer an auto attendant.
- The dispatcher will briefly hear music and then go directly to a LIVE operator.
- Operator will request the PSAP name and ask for the language needed.
- Operator will bring the interpreter on the line and then interpreting will begin.

The State 911 Department continues to work with the interpreter provider to improve the service.

### Massachusetts TERT has gone LIVE!

On December 1st, Massachusetts officially launched an intrastate Telecommunicator Emergency Response Taskforce (TERT) program! The MA TERT program is a team of certified and credentialed public safety telecommunicators who respond, relieve, assist and/or augment PSAPs affected by manmade or natural disasters. Fifty-seven (57) members across the Commonwealth are each assigned to one of four regional teams. The Massachusetts TERT program has been developed in partnership with the Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety and Security (EOPSS), the State 911 Department, the Statewide Office of Public Safety Interoperability (SIEC), and the Massachusetts Chapter of the National Emergency Number Association (MassNENA). The MA TERT team follows national training and credentialing standards established by the NJTI TERT (National Joint TERT Initiative). Credentialed TERT members are part of the Commonwealth's Communication Unit (COMU).

On December 6th, MA TERT held its first in-person training in Hudson, MA. During the meeting, team members learned about deployment expectations, reviewed supply considerations/callout procedures, and practiced some scenario drills.

**Need to add personnel to your grant listing?** Check the listing returned with the contract awarded. If an employee for whom you wish to submit reimbursement for is not on this listing, you simply need to submit a request to <a href="mailto:911DeptGrants@mass.gov">911DeptGrants@mass.gov</a> providing last name, first name, hourly pay rate and overtime pay rate. Such request shall be submitted by an authorized signatory. This is the sole means of adding individuals to a PSAP grant. Issuance of a NG-9-1-1 user id does not serve as a request to add employees to the grants. **Check the list** before submitting your reimbursement requests.



**Snow idea?** While the weather outside is frightful this might be a great time to hunker down and prepare those reimbursement requests. We are now halfway through our fiscal year, yet the flurry of reimbursement activity is slow. Guidelines require submission within 30 days of costs being incurred. Calendar year end is a good time to review and begin preparation for fiscal year end. Submitting reimbursements timely will assist with this process.



**Oh Dear! Need Help?** The State 911 Department will continue to host its reimbursement workshops on the third Wednesday of the month beginning at 11:00 AM. The workshop is scheduled for 1.5 hours and provides information on the reimbursement process, forms and needed documentation. **Wrap it up!** The State 911 Department will be hosting a virtual Regional Development Grant Workshop on Thursday, January 19, 2023, beginning at 10:30 AM. The workshop will review the Grant Guidelines, the application process and documentation. This is an opportunity to get your questions answered to allow you to wrap up the application for filing by March 2, 2023.

#### **Updates from our Systems Division**

MassGIS has trails information from the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR). A new trails layer for the 911 system is MassGIS' first attempt at a statewide, multi-sourced dataset. This layer was created from two primary sources, DCR trails and the Metropolitan Area Planning Council's Trailmap {trailmap.mapc.org}. In addition to these sources, a few other relatively small trail networks were added from Open Street Map (OSM), municipalities, and conservation organizations.

Trails will be maintained as part of the 9-1-1 project and will be refreshed monthly. The number of updates will vary depending on the frequency of inputs from 9-1-1 staff and public sources.

There are many missing trails from this layer and it is hoped that it becomes more complete over time. If you would like to submit trails for inclusion in this dataset, please contact MassGIS using the following email Notify911Address@mass.gov.

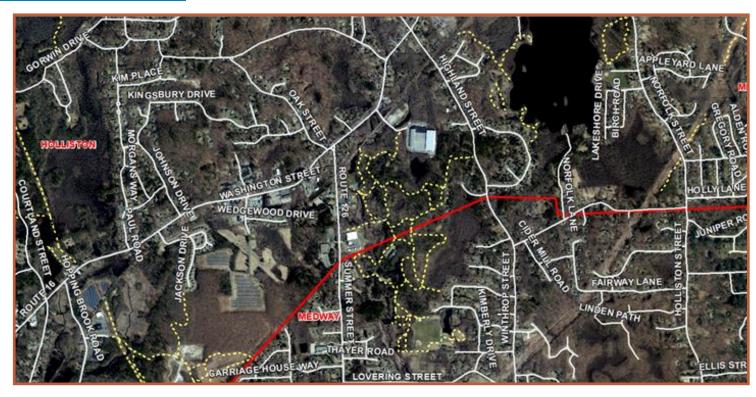
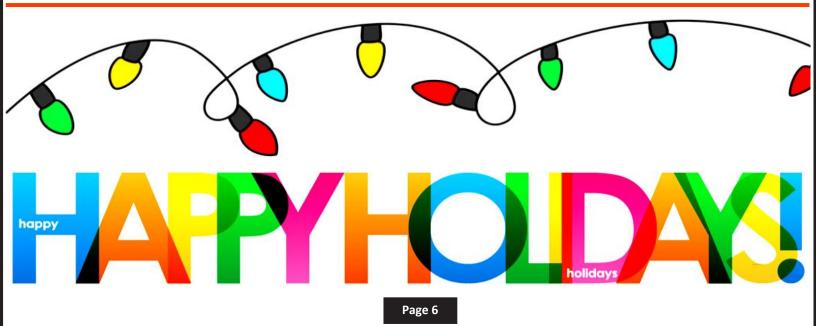


Image 1: New trails (in yellow) in the vicinity between Medway and Holliston



#### Updates from MassEDP

The Massachusetts Equipment Distribution Program (MassEDP) provides adaptive telephone equipment to people who have difficulty using a landline or wireless telephone due to issues such as hearing loss or vision loss. The telephones that are part of the Program can assist with providing a more clear, independent phone communication and the ability to contact 9-1-1 in the event of an emergency. The specialized telephone equipment is offered to people with a permanent disability for little or no cost, depending on income level.
