October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month!



In following the efforts of the Pink Patch Project the State 911 Department has gone "pink" for the month of October. Approximately 1 in every 8 woman, and 1 in every 833 men will be diagnosed with the disease of breast cancer in their lifetime. Throughout the month of October, many Massachusetts Public Safety Agencies have joined the goal of the Pink Patch Project to increase and bring awareness to the life-saving benefits of early detection and early intervention in fighting the battle against breast cancer. The impacts of this disease affect not only the individual, but families, friends, and communities as well. It is the hope that by increasing awareness the number of early detection cases and the number of lives saved by beating this horrific disease will increase as well.

Updates from our Programs Division

Telecommunicator Certification Program

This month, the State 911 Department began to include civilians interested in becoming 9-1-1 dispatchers in our training programs. Participants will receive certifications in the 2-day, Next Generation 9-1-1 Equipment training and the 40-hour, APCO PST1 class. The Telecommunicator Certification Program (TCP) is available for people that are interested in working in a 9-1-1 center, but lack the necessary certifications to apply for the position when vacancies become available.

The Department is hopeful that the program will assist 9-1-1 PSAPs that are having difficulty staffing their centers by providing them with 9-1-1 certified applicants applying for employment.

The Department encourages PSAPs to continue sending us your job postings so that we can advertise them on our website at <u>www.mass.gov/e911</u> and share them with participants of the TCP.

The Department will again host 2 informational workshops in November for civilians interested in learning more about the TCP. Dates and time are listed below:

Updates from our Fiscal Division



The Office of the State Comptroller has advised that it will be releasing an update to the Commonwealth's standard contract form. Contracts submitted under the State 911 Department grant programs not executed prior to this release may require a PSAP/RECC to execute this latest version. The State 911 Department will forward the new form for execution, if required. In addition, the applications will be updated to include this updated form.



The application period for the FY 2020 State 911 Department grant programs closes on Friday, January 31, 2020. There are only three (3) months remaining. Apply today!



We are now a third of the way through the fiscal year. This is a good time to review your grants to ensure all personnel for whom you may request costs are listed, spending is on track, delivery of goods and services are on schedule, and budget modifications, if needed, are filed as well as reimbursement requests.



PSAPs/RECCs are reminded to submit requests for approval for all anticipated trainings that are not currently on the approved course list. This request must be submitted by an authorized signatory under the grant program and should be sent to <u>911DeptGrants@mass.gov</u>.
