

Updates from PSAP Operations Division — Framingham

Our PSAP Operations Division in Framingham processes thousands of 911 calls every week from areas throughout the Commonwealth. As a result, we often receive requests from our partner agencies, the courts, the public, and the press for 911 call recordings or records for calls that were received and processed at the PSAP.

Our Records Access Officer processes these requests in accordance with the public records law and State 911 Department policies and procedures, often in consultation with our General Counsel.

Depending on the type of request or incident, this may involve contacting your agency if it was involved with the call, to confirm from an authorized person at your agency whether or not the incident is under investigation, or part of any other court proceedings.

If your agency needs information regarding 911 call recordings or records for any calls that originated at State 911 PSAP Operations-Framingham, please email 911recordings.RAO@mass.gov or call the RAO office at 508-820-2116 with any questions.

Updates from Mass EDP

On Tuesday, December 10, 2019 Massachusetts Equipment Distribution Program (MassEDP) Manager Grant Harrison, and State 911 Department Public Education Coordinator Katelyn Sylvia, spent the morning at the Massachusetts Office on Disability (MOD) in Boston. The morning was spent exchanging program information and brainstorming ideas on collaborating for future outreach efforts. Thank you to MOD Executive Director, Mary McCauley for inviting us to visit with your staff. We enjoyed our time and look forward to working closely with you all in the future.



During the time spent at MOD our Department staff was educated on the Disability Emergency Preparedness program that is run by MOD. This program is designed to make sure that people with disabilities in communities around the Commonwealth have the help they need in an emergency. The **Emergency Preparedness Program** shares their crucial information with the public through hosting meetings. During these meetings, their mission is to help communities be better prepared for emergencies as well as bring people with disabilities together with local emergency planners and first responders.

As part of the Emergency Preparedness Program, since 2007 MOD has handed out over 9,000 personal preparedness backpacks. The backpack as well as what is given inside of it is pictured to the left. Some items include: hand warmers, tissues, personal hygiene items, a flashlight, packets of emergency purified drinking water, a first aid kit, and a 14 in 1 pocket tool.

WESTCOMM Regional Emergency Communications Center

The WESTCOMM Regional Emergency Communications Center (RECC) went live on Tuesday, December 10, 2019. The regional PSAP is processing 911 calls for the City of Chicopee and the Town of Longmeadow. The call center is located at Chicopee Police Headquarters and managed by PSAP Director, Erin Hastings. The center is currently staffed with 20 civilian dispatchers.

Prior to the opening of the center, Chicopee Police and Fire dispatch were staffed with sworn personnel. Since going live and transitioning call center staff to civilian dispatchers, police officers and firefighters are now back on the road and Chicopee Fire Station #7 has been reopened after being closed for almost 14 years.
