Complete Streets Round 7 Massachusetts De Highway Div



Since 2016:

- 201 Policies passed
- 164 Technical Assistance Grants awarded
- 106 Construction Grants awarded (\$33M)

Bike/Ped Improvements – River Crossings

Charles River Dam Road

- Added continuous bike lanes from before Land Boulevard to Leverett Circle
 - · Separated with flex posts where feasible
 - · Adds dedicated bicycle signals
 - Will install speed feedback signs
- Provides 2 travel lanes in each direction
 - · Dedicated left turn lane at Museum Way
 - Removes 1 travel lane (5 total lanes)

Longfellow Bridge

- Installed flex posts for the length of the bridge
- Installed speed feed back signs
- Currently in the process of increasing the width of the inbound bike lane approach to match the City of Cambridge's roadway enhancements
- Installation of raised crosswalks at the Memorial Drive inbound ramps in 2020

Boston University Bridge

Added flex posts for safe transition at both ends of the bridge

Massachusetts Avenue Bridge

Will be installing speed feedback signs

Clarendon Street Ramp Closure



Ramp on Clarendon Street to I-90 WB closed permanently on 9/3/2019

- Safety Issues:
 - Sightline is almost 1,000 feet shorter than required
 - Acceleration lane is almost 300 feet shorter than required
 - 5X the crash rate compared to other ramps in the area with ¼ the amount of vehicles





Kelley Sq - Worcester





- Transforms a high crash intersection with a Hybrid Roundabout
- Includes Worcester's first dedicated bike lane
- Bids opened on 9/10/19: \$14.68 million by JH Lynch & Sons
- Construction Starts: October 2019
- Substantial Completion: March 2021

Casey Arborway








- Removed 1600' structurally deficient overpass
