



Tunnel Shutdown – Two Seasons








Condition of Tunnel

Mitigation Strategies



Ongoing community engagement



Safety: Contingency plans and ongoing coordination with Boston Fire, Police, Emergency Services, and Hospitals



Real time and on the ground traffic monitoring and detour modification when needed



Two-way communication with the public via dedicated project email and hotline



Coordination with the MBTA to ensure public transit options



Ferry service from East Boston for duration of project



Coordination with GPS companies

Updating the public throughout the project timeline



Mitigation Strategies

- Remode on Transit
 - Free Ferry From East Boston
 - Free monthly MBTA pass for July and August for those registered in the East Boston Resident Discount Program and certain residents of Revere and Winthrop
 - Zone 1A fares for Salem and Swampscott inbound and outbound CR
 - Reduced price for MBTA parking at BL Wonderland station, down to \$2/day
 - Additional parking near Wood island MBTA Station
 - Open South Boston I-90 EB emergency ramp for SL1 buses
- If You Have To Drive
 - Discounted tolls in the Ted Williams Tunnel and the Tobin Bridge for those registered in the Toll Discount Program
 - Optimizing signal timing and installing RTTM



Route 79 / Davol Street – Fall River





Current Work:

\$115M project to remove the viaduct and reconfigure the Rt. 79 Interchange, reconnect neighborhoods, and provide multi-modal accommodations to improve overall mobility and enable economic development opportunities. Route 79 has been closed permanently and all traffic has been shifted to Davol Street

Spring Cleaning

Litter Pickup has started and will continue throughout the Summer and Fall, utilizing:

- In-house labor forces
- Contractor Services
- Inmate Crews, when available
- Coordination with volunteer organizations
- Adopt-A-Highway
- Messaging Campaign

Earth Day 2023


