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## **DECISION**

EL MARCADO RESTAURANT INC. D/B/A MEXICALI FRESH MEX GRILL

El Marcado Restaurant Inc. d/b/a Mexicali Fresh Mex Grill (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, February 21, 2017, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Velez's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Velez's Compliance Check Field Report dated May 23, 2016; and
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

## **FACTS**

- 1. On Monday, May 23, 2016, at approximately 4:30 p.m., Investigators Binienda and Velez ("Investigators") investigated the business operation of El Marcado Restaurant Inc. d/b/a Mexicali Fresh Mex Grill.
- 2. An underage operative, working with Investigators, was in possession of an alcoholic beverage, a bottle of Budweiser Light beer. The underage operative was not asked for identification.

## **CONCLUSION**

Based on the evidence the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
