We expand what's possible by providing community support, technology, and training that breaks down barriers to create a Massachusetts that's truly equitable, accessible, and inclusive.

Home + Community Life programs and services

MassAbility partners with you to discover the programs and services that fit your needs. Our team will support you in providing the right information, determining your eligibility, and working through the application process. Get connected with one of our programs today.

Accessible housing registry

The accessible housing registry is a free program that matches you to available accessible housing options across Massachusetts. You can search for homes based on location, affordability, space, and particular accessibility features.

Home care

MassAbility's home care program provides services so you can safely live in your home. The program helps secure in-home support, including house cleaning, laundry, meal preparation, grocery shopping, and medication pick-up.

Independent living centers

Independent living centers are available across
Massachusetts, providing you with peer counseling, skills
training, advocacy, and information to keep you living as
independently as possible. They also keep MassAbility
informed of what community members need so that
MassAbility can provide support when necessary.

Moving Forward Program

The Moving Forward Program allows Massachusetts to "waive" or set aside certain Medicaid (MassHealth) regulations if you are living in a nursing home or rehabilitation hospital. The program helps you return to the community with any assistance you may need. MassAbility provides case management support to guide you through the process and answer any questions that come up.

Statewide head injury program

The statewide head injury program empowers people living with a traumatic brain injury to live life on their own terms. The program provides services such as skills training, community case management, assistive technology, residential services, and access to brain injury community centers across Massachusetts.

Supported living program (ages 16+)

The supported living program assists youth and adults ages 16 and older with severe disabilities to live independently in the community. The program supports you in managing daily activities, such as personal care attendants, paying bills and money management, finding or maintaining housing, and coordinating health services.

Transition to adulthood program (ages 14-22)

Transition to adulthood programs are available to young people with disabilities ages 14 to 22 who are enrolled in special education. This program offers individual and group activities to help you learn skills and self-confidence that prepare you to live independently in the community as an adult.
