


Mass DEP DWP Flow Chart Process for Lead in Drinking Water Sampling


The purpose of this flowchart series is to assist Massachusetts consumers in determining who to contact to test their drinking water for lead and how to act after receiving lead sample results. Recommended actions can differ if the consumer is served by a private well or a public water supplier (PWS), and if the consumer is a homeowner or renter. Please follow chart 1, then move to charts 2-5 based on the results of chart 1.




