Re: House 2546, An Act to Exempt the Executive Director of the Municipal Police Training Committee from Earnings Limitations

Dear Chair Brady and Chair Gordon:

As your committee considers House 2546, An Act to Exempt the Executive Director of the Municipal Police Training Committee from Earnings Limitations, I write to express my strong opposition to the bill. House 2546 circumvents the principle of the Return-to-Work law, specifically that a public employee should not receive both a full salary and a full pension from public bodies simultaneously.

Creating an exemption for a specific, full-time position from a law that applies to all other public employees is especially concerning. This would be the only individual position exempted from these caps; all other positions exempted under the current law apply to a class of employees. To that end, I oppose this legislation and have opposed similar iterations of this language in an outside section of the Fiscal Year 2024 budget.

I respectfully urge the Committee to reject changes to the post-retirement rules that appear to be contrary to the purpose of a public pension.
