Affordability: It All Comes Down to the Rent

This chart can serve as a helpful reference when thinking about the rent types we group on our website. Note that we are not administrators of housing vouchers and any questions should be directed at your RAA or Housing Authority

	Rent Based on Income \$	Fixed Below Market Rent \$\$	Market Rent \$\$\$
What's the rent?	30% of your household income; <i>adjusts</i> if your income goes up or down	Set rent based on 30% of a certain local income level aka AMI – not adjusted to your income	Set by market, no subsidy, often not affordable. Not shown on our website
Example types of housing	Public housing; housing with project based vouchers ("Section 8 housing")	LIHTC ("Tax Credit") housing, 40B developments	Anything with no restriction

80% AMI (note this is the AMI limit for public housing) is both eligibility <u>and</u> affordability for this household	60% AMI is the eligibility for this unit <u>but not affordability</u> for this household	Neither eligibility nor affordability for this household
~30% of their household income	Rent = more than this household can pay (more than half of income)	Rent = more than this household's monthly income

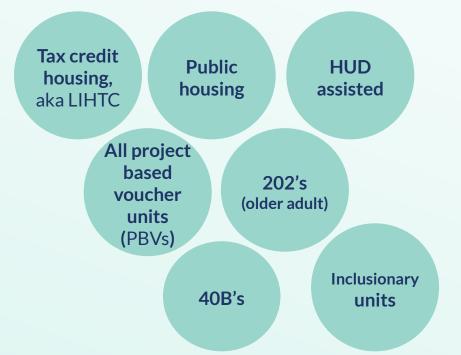

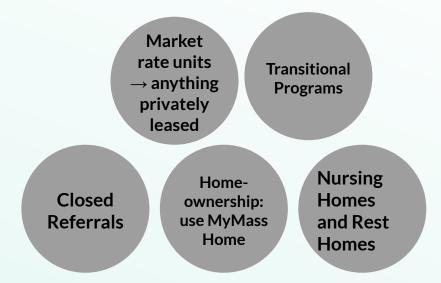

Туре	Definition	Do We Include It in Our Data?	Why or Why Not?
Independent Living	Housing provided for elderly and/or disabled residents with five core services: Information & Referral, Peer Support, Skills Training, Advocacy, and Transition.	Yes!	Affordable, permanent housing
Assisted Living	Assisted Living Residences (ALRs) offer a combination of housing, meals and personal care services to adults for a monthly fee that includes rent and services. Not for people who need severe medical care on an ongoing basis.	Yes!	Affordable, permanent housing
Nursing Home	Nursing homes provide a wide range of health and personal care with more focus on providing medical services to residents.	No	Medical facility with different requirements and funding
Rest Home	Rest homes provide 24-hour supervision and supportive services for individuals who don't routinely need nursing or medical care. Rest homes provide housing, meals, activities, and administration of medications for individuals who need a supportive living arrangement.	No	Medical facility with different requirements and funding

Rental Assistance

Direct financial aid (housing vouchers) to make private market rent affordable for LTSS users.



Supportive Housing Models

Integrating housing units with on-site access to LTSS and coordination.



Health & LTSS Services

MassHealth services that fund supports to *maintain* community living.



Prevention & Modification

Programs to prevent homelessness or adapt homes for accessibility.

EOHLC: Central Resources	Resource Locator by city/town and How to Start Looking for Affordable Housing
AHVP (Alternative Housing Voucher)	State-funded mobile voucher for people with disabilities under age 60. <u>Learn More</u>
Section 8	Federal vouchers, some set aside for people transitioning from facilities and non-elderly disability support. <u>Learn More</u>
811 Project Rental Assistance (PRA)	State housing authorities are often required to partner with MassHealth to identify and refer low-income individuals with disabilities to specific integrated supportive housing units, such as those funded through federal programs like the Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) or Section 811 Project Rental Assistance (PRA)
RAFT	The Residential Assistance for Families in Transition (RAFT) program provides short-term emergency funding to help you with eviction, foreclosure, loss of utilities, and other housing emergencies. Eligibility specifics are here .



Supportive Housing Models

Program	Function
	Reserves 3% of units in MassHousing-financed properties specifically for individuals enrolled in DMH or DDS services
MassHousing DMH/DDS Set-Aside	NOTE : MassHousing's DMH/DDS Set-Aside Program and the Massachusetts 3% Priority Program (3% Set-Aside) require property owners to provide priority access to 3% of all low- and moderate-income units for referrals from the Departments of Mental Health (DMH) and Developmental Services (DDS), the Executive Office of Aging & Independence, and MassAbility (formerly the Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission).
Supportive Housing Program	Integrates services Aging Services Access Points (ASAPs) to create supportive living environments in state-funded public housing. Overview on housing resources for older adults is here
Congregate Housing	Shared living space in public housing with on-site support services. More specifics are <u>here</u>

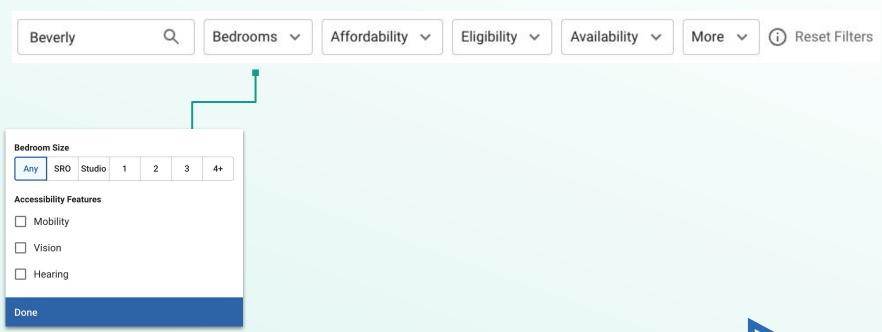

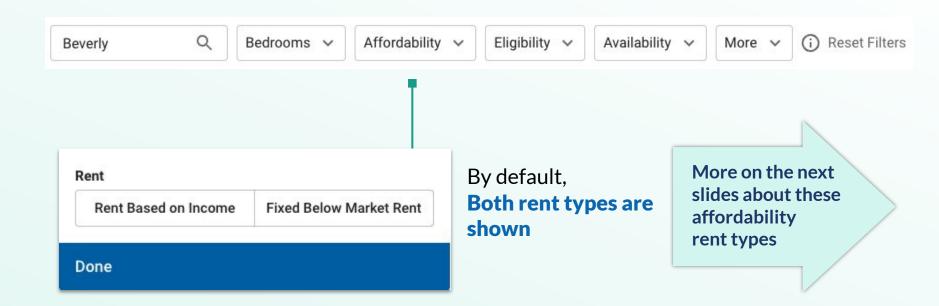

Affordability





Affordability: Rent Based on Income

This property affordability type sets monthly rental costs based on the income of an eligible household.

Rent = about 30% of household gross income; this adjusts if income goes up or down. These units will typically be the **most affordable** to you.

 Examples of property types where you pay Rent Based on Income: Housing with project based vouchers (commonly referred to as "Section 8 housing"); public housing units This will be on the property description page if it is Rent Based on Income

Affordability: Fixed Below Market Rent

Housing units with a **set rent** (rather than a rent based on a household's exact income). This set rent is below the market rate rent for the area, and may also be referred to as tax credit housing, workforce housing, 40B housing, or inclusionary housing. These units always have minimum income requirements.

- Note that if you have a mobile rental voucher, the minimum income requirements for a Fixed Below Market Rent unit will not apply and you will pay rent based on the mobile voucher program (such as mobile Section 8, HCVP, MRVP, or AHVP).
- Tenants receiving a voucher generally pay 30-40% of their income towards housing and the balance is covered by a housing authority or other voucher subsidizing agency – allowing for an eligible unit to also become affordable.
- Under Fair Housing laws in Massachusetts, a landlord cannot discriminate against someone for having a housing voucher.

Our research provides the data-driven insights needed to build the right affordable housing solutions across Massachusetts.

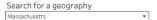
- <u>Data Opens Doors: Measuring Our Affordable Housing Gap</u>, completed in collaboration with the

Non-Age Restricted Units, by Rent Type and Unit Size



Fixed Below Market Rent units have rents set at a fixed, below-market level. For Rent Based on Income units, the rent is set as a percentage (typically 30%) of the household's income. Due to gaps in details for 0.4% of our inventory, there may be minor discrepancies between totals and detailed breakdowns.



What the Dashboards Tell Us

Our Affordable Housing Supply Dashboards are a go-to resource visualizing what we have so we can build what we need.

- → Number of total affordable units & properties
- → Affordability: How rent is determined
- → Bedroom Mix & Age-Restriction: Who are they for?

The Problem:

People are encountering misinformation and getting lost while looking for resources, leading to further confusion about how to find affordable housing.

Help eligible people quickly find relevant affordable housing opportunities, saving them time and lowering stress.

Renter Eligibility + Education Tool

The Problem:

People are not sure where to begin in applying filters and narrowing down what they are interested in versus what they are truly eligible for. We drop renters in expect them to find their way from there

Provide insight into how the affordable housing ecosystem works and nuance of certain rules of eligibility for different criteria
