Seeking Qualified Candidates Interested in Joint Appointment to Position of Inspector General

Pursuant to <u>General Laws Chapter 12A, § 2</u>, we are currently seeking applicants for the position of Inspector General to be jointly appointed by the Attorney General, the State Auditor, and the Governor.

The Inspector General serves as the administrative head of the Office of the Inspector General, which acts to prevent and detect fraud, waste and abuse in the expenditure of public funds, whether state, federal, or local, or relating to programs and operations involving the procurement of any supplies, services, or construction, by agencies, bureaus, divisions, sections, departments, offices, commissions, institutions and activities of the commonwealth. <u>G.L. Ch.</u> <u>12A, § 7.</u>

By statute, the person appointed shall be selected without regard to political affiliation and solely on the basis of integrity and demonstrated ability in accounting, auditing, financial analysis, law, management analysis, public administration, investigation or criminal justice administration.

The term of this appointment is for five (5) years. The Inspector General may be reappointed for a second five-year term. This is a paid position. <u>G.L. Ch. 12A, § 5.</u>
