## NOTICE OF FILING, PUBLIC HEARING, AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 25-48

May 27, 2025

Investigation by the Department of Public Utilities On Its Own Motion Into the Interconnection Implementation Review Group's Proposed Revisions to the Model Standards for Interconnection of Distributed Generation Tariff.

On March 25, 2025, the Interconnection Implementation Review Group ("IIRG") submitted to the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") proposed revisions to the Model Standards for Interconnection of Distributed Generation Tariff ("DG Interconnection Tariff"). The Department has docketed this submission as D.P.U. 25-48 and, on May 27, 2025, the Department opened an investigation into this matter.

The IIRG is a Department-sanctioned working group established under <u>Distributed</u> <u>Generation Interconnection</u>, D.P.U. 19-55-F (2023). The IIRG provides a forum to identify and discuss issues related to DG interconnection and to ensure continued review of DG interconnection standards and procedures. The IIRG members collaborated over the past year and a half to identify its proposed revisions to the DG Interconnection Tariff, specifically to the Simplified and Expedited interconnection process requirements set forth in the DG Interconnection Tariff. These processes set out operational actions necessary for a DG facility to connect with an electric distribution company's ("Distribution Company")<sup>1</sup> electric power system ("EPS"). For the Simplified Process, the revisions proposed in the IIRG filing are intended to: (1) increase the amount of DG projects that qualify for the Simplified Process and to align system capacities with Net Metering rules; (2) meet the needs of energy storage systems ("ESS") and other technologies

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allowing for more flexible interconnections with limited energy export capacity and other field control concepts; and (3) understand and explore ways to address system modification costs for projects under the Simplified Process. The IIRG's filing includes broad revisions regarding the Expedited Process under the DG Interconnection Tariff. The revisions are intended to create more predictability for DG facility owners and developers that apply for interconnection to the EPS. The IIRG's proposed revisions are designed to enable more DG projects, including ESS projects, to be evaluated under the Expedited Process and not to be assigned to the Standard Process for interconnection and therefore interconnect faster.

The Department intends to conduct this examination into the IIRG's proposed revisions to the DG Interconnection Tariff as a Notice of Investigation ("NOI") into a Model DG Interconnection Tariff, not as an adjudicatory proceeding. Depending on the outcome of this NOI, each Distribution Company may be required to file a Distribution Company-specific DG Interconnection Tariff for review and approval by the Department. The Department may conduct that review as an adjudicatory proceeding.

The Department will conduct a virtual public hearing to receive comments on the IIRG's filing. The Department intends to hold an informal, informational session immediately following the public hearing to allow IIRG members to provide context for the filing and to allow the Department to ask basic questions. During the public hearing, any member of the public will be able to provide comments. The Department will conduct a public hearing on **Tuesday**, **June 17**, **2025**, beginning at 2:00 p.m. Attendees can join by entering the link https://us06web.zoom.us/j/81327462826, from a computer, smartphone, or tablet.
