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INTRODUCTION AND SUPPORTING TASK FORCE MISSION

Mission "*Combating Contraband Tobacco and Ensuring Compliance*" The Task force empowers:

- sharing information and resource across agencies to maximize enforcement efforts
- coordinating efforts multi-agency actions against illicit trade
- Carrying out Effective enforcement and investigative strategies
- Identifying where illegal tobacco is prevalent and target investigations
- Assessing existing investigative and enforcement methods and improve those methods
- Soliciting cooperation to other enforcement agencies and prosecuting authorities





II. CHALLENGES IN COMBATING CONTRABAND TOBACCO

II. Challenges in Combating Contraband Tobacco

Massachusetts "An Act Modernizing Tobacco Control" ban sale of flavored tobacco products and 75% increase on excise tax of ENDS impact to the Task Force:

- Multi Agency expansion of scope of investigations and law enforcement efforts
- Increased incentive for illicit tobacco trade from neighboring low tax states
 - Illicit sale of banned flavored tobacco
 - Low tax products traffic across border states
- New License requirements for ENDS retailers
 - Increment the number of inspection targets

MASSACHUSETTS TOBACCO TAX RATES

- Massachusetts is ranked 6th in the U.S. for its cigarette tax of \$3.51 per pack
- Cigars and smoking tobacco are subject to a state excise tax of 40% of the wholesale price
- Smokeless tobacco is subject to a 210% state excise of the wholesale price.
- ENDS is subject to 75% wholesale price

ESTIMATED TAX RATES COMPARISON E-CIGS AND VAPES

States tobacco tax policies and tax rates on e-cigs and ENDS vary widely. ENDS taxes aim to achieve parity with taxes on cigarettes. The table below is an example of Estimated Tax on Selected E-cigarettes, Based on Cigarette-Parity Ad Valorem Rates. The extract of the table below¹ illustrates potential tax differentials compared to Massachusetts neighboring states.

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CHALLENGES FIGHTING ILLICIT ACTIVITY & INCOMPLIANCE INCENTIVES


"Commonwealth's high tax rates on OTP relative to other states provide smugglers an incentive to import such products from low-tax states and sell them to in-state buyers willing to illegally evade payment of the applicable Massachusetts tobacco excise.¹"

- All tobacco trafficking schemes, regardless of method, depend upon tax avoidance
- Current incentives for tax avoidance
 - Higher profit margins for the sale of an illicit pack of cigarettes, OTP, CIGARS ENDS
 - Consumer willingness to buy at lower price and banned flavor flavored products
 - Flavored ENDS products and cigars purchased from unlicensed distributors across state borders

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
IMPACT TO EXCISE TAX COLLECTION REVENUES



Percentage Change Revenues Across Categories



- Task Force identified the cross-border smuggling of untaxed flavored ENDS products, cigars, and menthol cigarettes as the primary challenge for tobacco enforcement in the Commonwealth.

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



ELECTRONIC VERIFICATION TRACK AND TRACE

Overview

- Validation of stamps observed in the field
- Ability to access product data using mobile field tool
- Capture of stamp scanning into SICPATRACE®

- Builds on existing tax stamp verification tools currently supplied by SICPA to MA DOR
- Cross-reference of retailer invoices to stamp origination
- Ensure tax compliance and products are authorized for sale in the Commonwealth

Overview


- Tax stamp program captures orders, movement, events and audit
- Information captured in reports can be exported and shared

- Product activation including sites, dates, and locations
- Site inspections enable stamp scanning for tracking and tracing

- Visual Inspections augment site inspections and invoice product matching




