

NO Service, NO Problem – Take the DWSP Public Access Maps with you!

Using the free app – [ArcGIS Field Maps](#) – you can download copies of the Public Access and Fishing Map to take on your next adventure using your mobile device. This is great when you are planning to explore somewhere remote with **no cell service**.

Download ArcGIS Field Maps from the App Store to get started ([iOS](#), [Android](#)).

Use the following instructions to locate the Public Access Maps and download a copy to your mobile device. *For best results, please ensure you are connected to WiFi or have at least 2 bars of cell service.*

1. Open the app and click "Skip Sign In".



Figure 1: Use the "Skip Sign In" option, highlighted in red, to start looking for maps within ArcGIS Field Maps.

2. Using the search box at the top of your screen, type "DCR-DWSP Public Access" or "DCR-DWSP Fishing Map".
3. Click the arrow (>) to the right of the result and browse offline areas. *You can also click directly on the result to open the map without downloading an offline copy.*

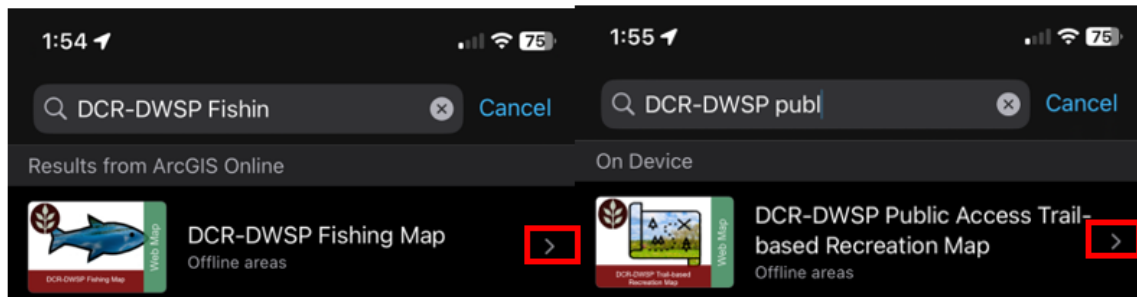
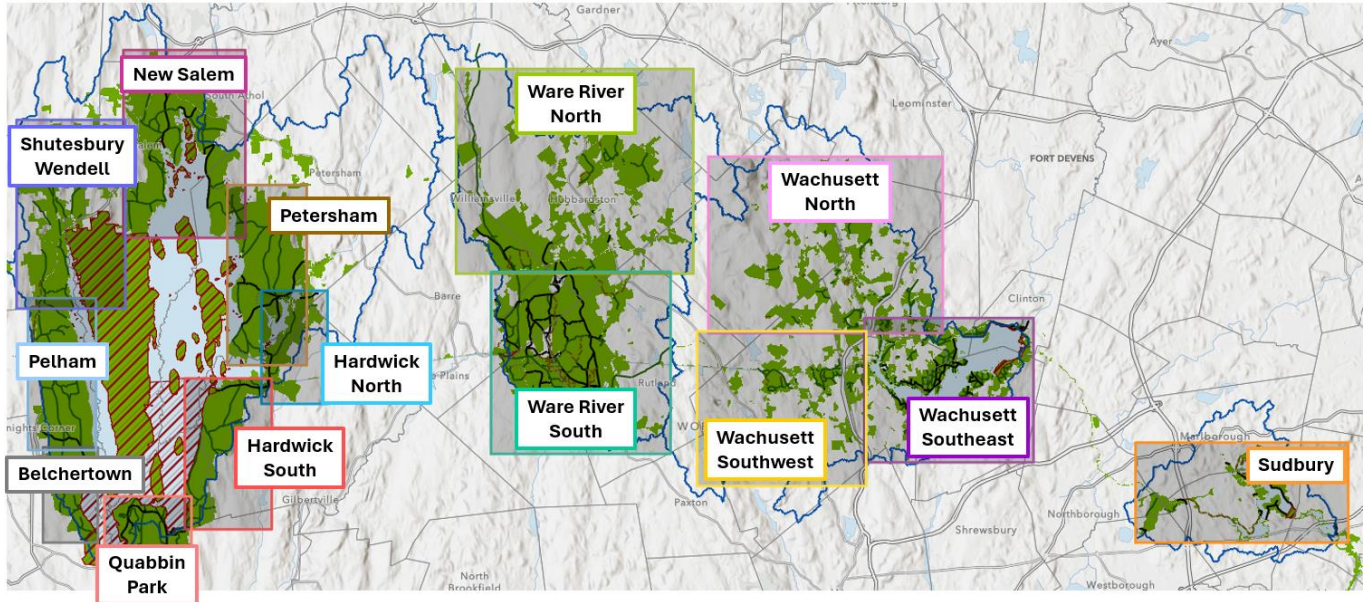


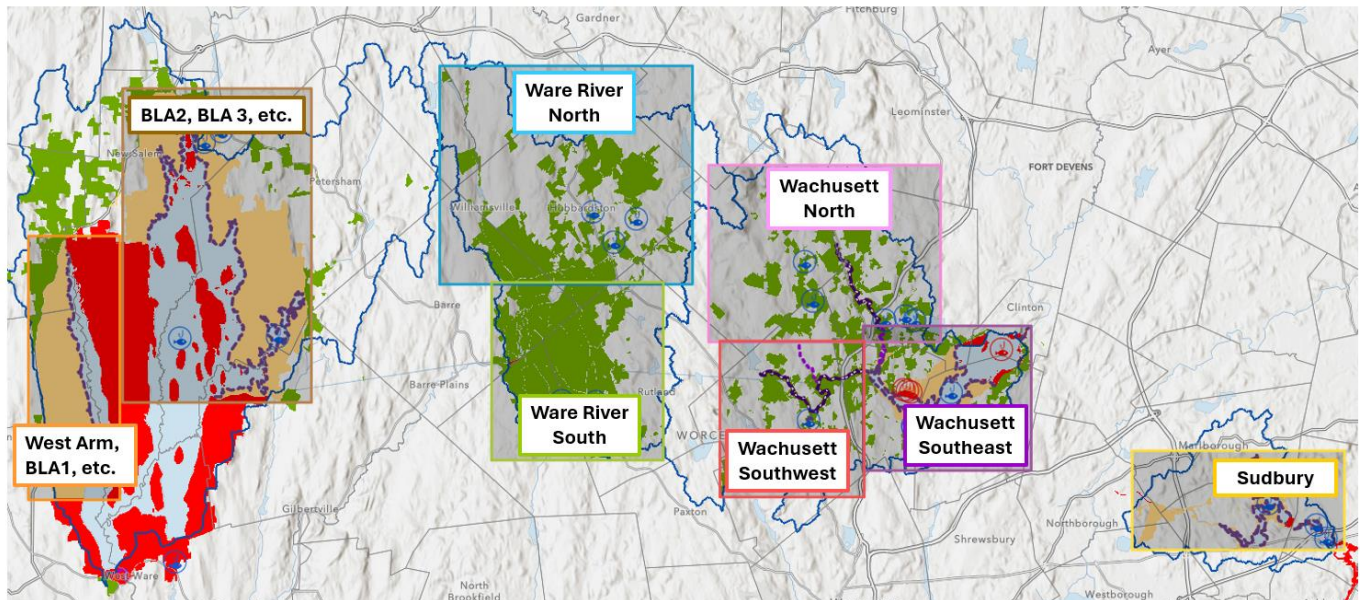
Figure 2: Use the search option along the top of the app to search for the DCR-DWSP Fishing Map or the DCR-DWSP Public Access Map. Click the > icon on the right side of the corresponding map card to get started downloading an offline area.

4. On the next screen determine which pre-made area you want to download to your mobile device. *The Fishing Map has 8 pre-made areas to choose from, and the Public Access Map has 14 pre-made areas to choose from.*

5. Click the blue download icon button to right of the area name to start the download.

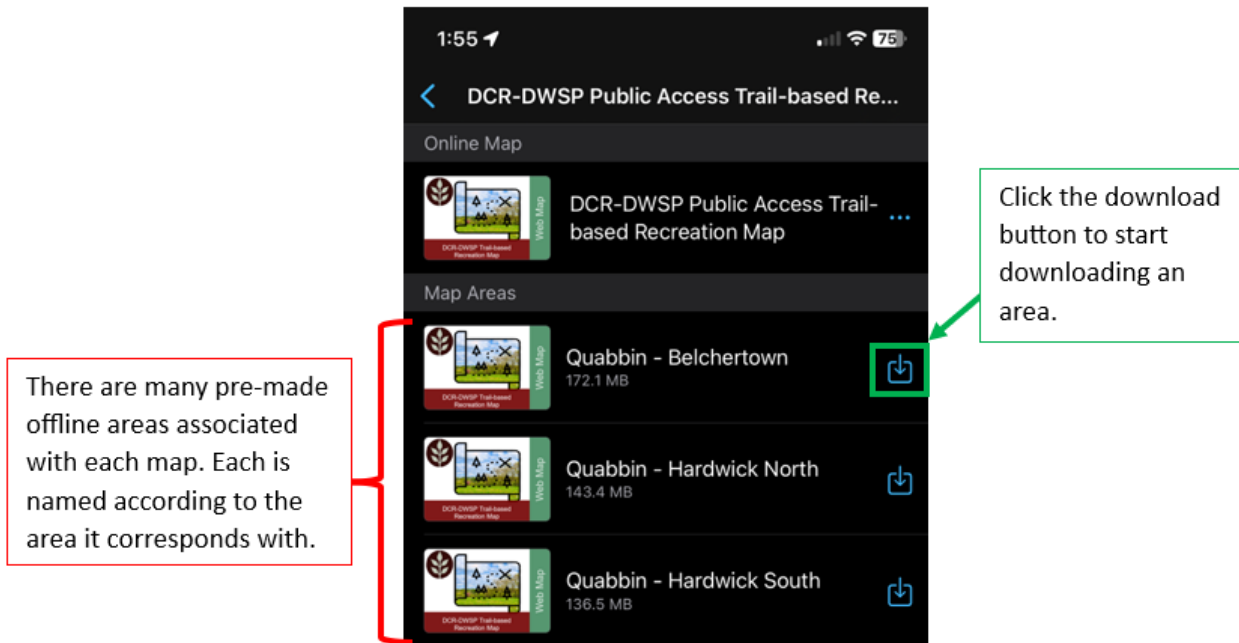


Figure 3: Once either the DCR-DWSP Fishing Map or DCR-DWSP Public Access Maps are selected, you can browse multiple pre-made offline areas to download for each map. Each option is named according to the area it corresponds with. Use the download button located on the right side of the corresponding card to start downloading an area.

Wait for the map to download. Please be patient as this could take a few minutes to complete.

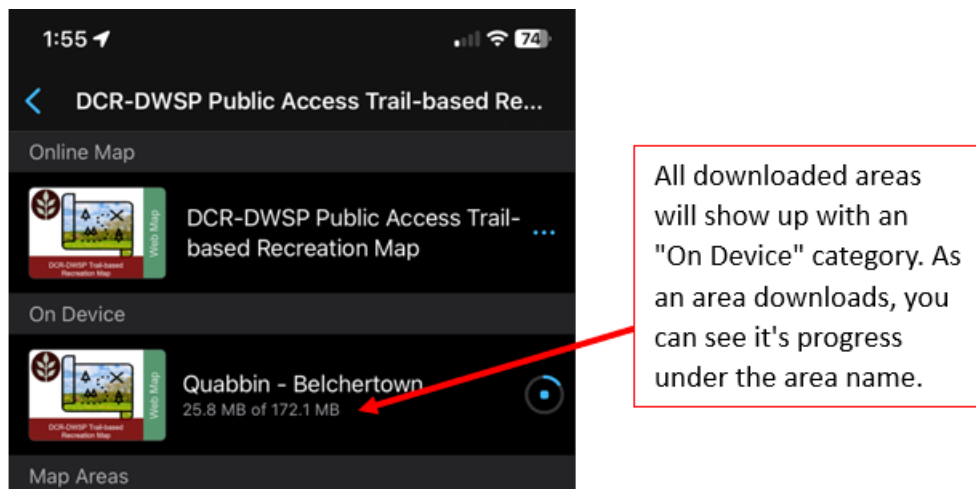


Figure 4: Once you begin a download, all downloaded areas will show up within an "On Device" category. As the area downloads, you will see it's progress under the area name.

6. Once your download is complete, tap on the map area to open the map and get started.

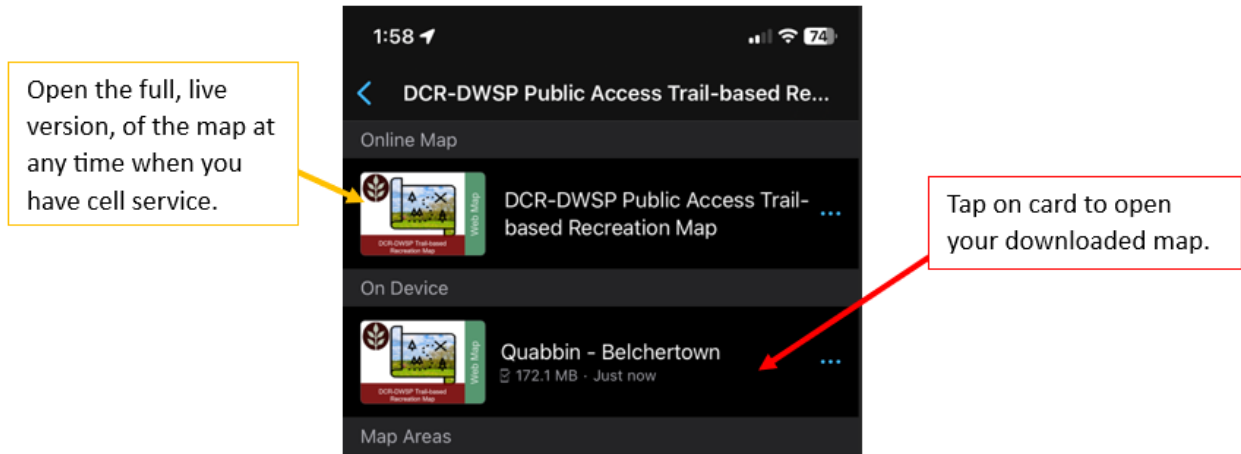


Figure 5: Once your download is complete, tap on the card to open your downloaded map. Even with one (or more) offline areas downloaded, you can open the full, live version of the map at any time when you have cell service.

Enabling Location Alerts – You will be asked to *enable location alerts* when you open the map. This will enable a feature that will notify you when you enter/exit No Trespassing areas, and when you leave DCR-DWSP property. Your location is only used within the app to determine when to notify you of entering or exiting one of these areas. Your location is not shared with DCR-DWSP staff or other people using the map.

Please be aware that your mobile's devices GPS accuracy will be displayed at the top of the map within ArcGIS Field Maps. This will help you to understand how reliable your location reading is.

Tips on using the Map:

Using Field Maps lets you do more than just see where you are! You can draw on the map, turn map layers on/off, drop pins (and add them as favorites – think parking spot, cool tree), navigate to pins using a compass and more.

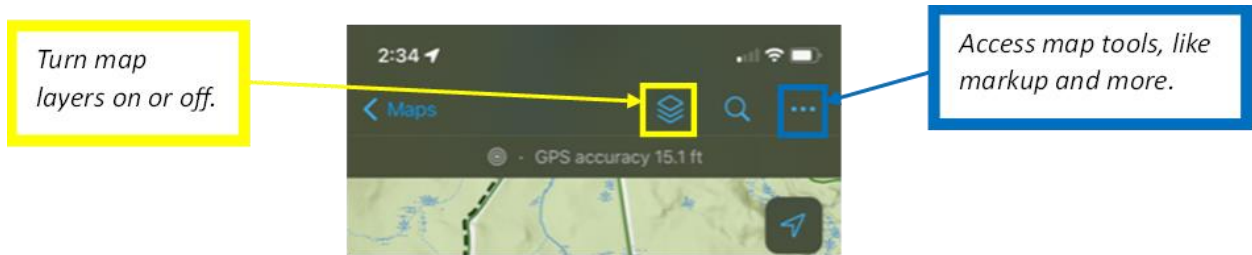


Figure 6: Once you open the map (live or an offline area), you can use various map tools to turn layers on or off, add markup, favorite locations and more!

Drop a pin:

1. Press and hold on your mobile device's screen to drop a pin.
2. At the bottom of the slider, select Favorite to name this pin in your map.

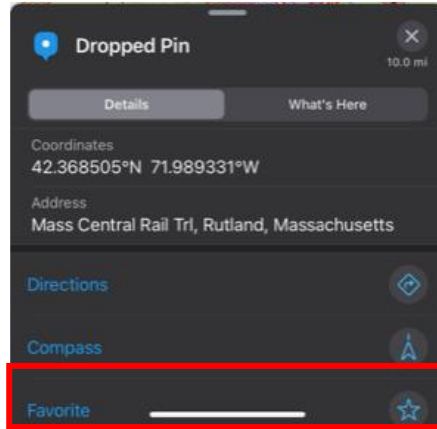


Figure 7: Once you've dropped a pin, click the "Favorite" option at the bottom of the menu to add this location to your favorites.

3. Select your pin and click the Compass option to navigate to a point. This will provide a bearing and distance, along with a dotted line for you to follow. The map will swivel based on the direction you're facing.

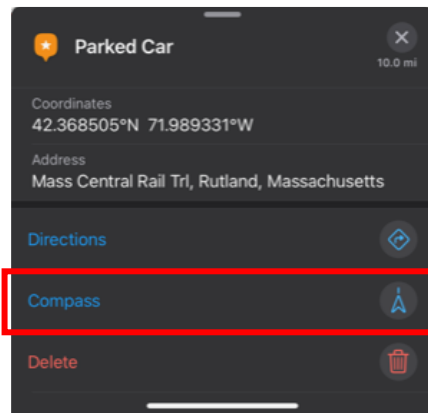


Figure 8: Use the compass option, located in the menu below your selected point, to aid in navigating to a favorite.
