

FACT SHEET

Theme: Introduction to Early Childhood Education¹

Courses cataloged under the "Introduction to ECE" theme fall into two subthemes: 1) Theory and Research: courses that address ECE from a macro level, focusing on theories and philosophies of ECE and how they shape the development of the field. These courses provide a comprehensive view of programs, including the history of early education and an exploration of terminology, issues, trends, law, and societal premises; and 2) Incorporating Theory into Practice: course that address the theoretical background, but also focus on micro level skills and practices for teaching in an ECE classroom, including developmentally appropriate practice, incorporating family and community, and observation and individualization techniques.
