Honorable Chairs and Ranking Minority Members of the Committees on Ways and Means:

Pursuant to Section 6 of Chapter 14 of the General Laws¹, the Department of Revenue (DOR) hereby submits its mid-month tax revenue report for the month of January 2023, the seventh month of fiscal year 2023. The attached table shows January 2023 month-to-date tax revenue collections through January 13, 2023, along with changes from the equivalent period in January 2022.

Revenue collections are uneven and usually weighted toward month-end. The brief period covered in the mid-month report does not provide sufficient data for comparison to prior years. Therefore, mid-month figures should not be used to assess trends or project future revenues.

Context for January Revenues

January is a significant month for revenues because many personal income taxpayers are required to make quarterly estimated payments. January generally produces about 10.2% of annual revenue, making it the fourth largest revenue month of the year.

Highlights

Total Tax collections for the month-to-date period were \$1.470 billion, virtually equal to the collections during the same period in January 2022. The month-to-date decreases in income tax withholding, non-withholding income tax, and "all other" taxes are offset by increases in corporate and business tax and sales tax.

- **Income Taxes** totaled \$1.217 billion, down \$68 million or 5.3% versus the same period in January 2022.
- Sales & Use Taxes totaled \$133 million, up \$47 million or 54.7% versus the same period in January 2022.
- **Corporate & Business Taxes** totaled \$79 million, up \$57 million or 258.7% versus the same period in January 2022.
- Other Taxes totaled \$42 million, down \$36 million or 46.1% versus the same period in January 2022.

Details

Total Income Tax of \$1.217 billion for mid-month January is comprised of the following:

- **Withholding** of \$828 million, down \$54 million versus the same period in January 2022.
- Estimated Payments of \$355 million, down \$11 million versus the same period in January 2022.
- **Returns/Bills** of \$48 million, up \$6 million versus the same period in January 2022.
- **Refunds** of \$15 million, up \$10 million (unfavorable) versus the same period in January 2022.

Sales & Use Tax of \$133 million, up \$47 million versus the same period in January 2022. Typically, only a small proportion of expected regular sales and meals tax remittances is received by the mid-month date. The month-to-date sales and use tax of \$133 million is comprised of the following:

- **Regular sales** tax of \$64 million, up \$22 million versus the same period in January 2022.
- Meals tax of \$24 million, up \$10 million versus the same period in January 2022.

• **Motor vehicle** sales tax of \$45 million, up \$15 million versus the same period in January 2022.

Corporate & Business Tax of \$79 million, up \$57 million versus the same period in January 2022. The month-to-date increase is mostly due to increases in corporate and business estimated and return payments and a decrease in refunds.

Other Taxes of \$42 million, down \$36 million versus the same period in January 2022, includes a number of tax categories such as motor fuels, cigarette, estate tax, room occupancy, and deeds.
