






December Precipitation & Departures

Precipitation



3-6 inch totals for most of the Commonwealth

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Departure from Normal

Departures were near to slightly above normal






3 and 6 Month Percent of Normal

Last 3 Months (Oct-Dec)

• Mostly 50-75% with some areas closer to normal (75-100%)




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Last 6 Months (Jul-Dec)

• Mostly 50-75% with some areas closer to normal (75-100%)








Average Temperatures

December: Near to Slightly Below Normal



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January I-5: Above normal








7 Day Precipitation Forecast

Through Mon January 13

- Dry and cold this week.
- Potential for up to 0.50" of precipitation (snow) next weekend
- Highly uncertain coastal storm may track well offshore and we remain dry, or it may graze south coastal MA






Chance of seeing 0.25" or more of precipitation over the weekend. Note the chances are fairly low (less than 20%) and focused on southeast MA including Cape Cod and the Islands. This would be could enough for snow.

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






Outlook: Mon Jan 13 - Sun Jan 19

Odds favor above below precipitation and below normal temperatures



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






Outlook: Sat Jan 18 - Fri Jan 31

Odds favor above normal precipitation with no clear signal for above/below normal temperatures



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






Outlook for Feb, Mar, Apr

Odds favor above normal temperatures with no clear signal for above/below normal precipitation



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Summary

<u>December</u>: Near normal temperatures and precipitation

- Precipitation was within an inch of normal for most of the Commonwealth • Slightly above normal (1-2 inches) in part of southeast Massachusetts
- Temperatures were within a degree of normal

Longer Range Precipitation Departures:

some areas closer to normal (75-100%)

Outlook:

- Dry and cold this week.
- high it could very well pass offshore and maintain dry/cold weather in MA
- Odds favor below average temperatures and precipitation through the middle of the month
- temperatures

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• 3-month and 6-month departures have shown some recovery with most areas 50-75% of normal and

• Potential for a coastal storm to bring up to 0.50" precipitation (snow) next weekend but uncertainty is • Possible trend toward a wetter pattern for late January but no clear signal for above or below normal
