Legislative Updates

An Act regarding families and children in need of assistance (H.134/S.101) Reported favorably by CFPD & sent to Ways & Means

An Act promoting diversion of juveniles to community supervision and services (H.1495/S.940) Extension order (until 4/30/2024)

An Act updating bail procedures for justiceinvolved youth (H.1494/S.993)


 Extension order filed (until 4/30/2024) but budget inclusion



Massachusetts Youth Diversion Program (MYDP) Updates


- As of 3/1 the program has received referrals and enrolled 358 participants. Of those enrolled, 259 youth have successfully completed the program and 90 are currently on track to complete the program in the coming weeks and months
- MYDP is currently operational in five counties: Worcester, Essex, Middlesex, Hampden, and Plymouth and ramping up two new sites in Bristol and Barnstable Counties
- OCA to release "Year 2 Data Report"
- ForHealth Consulting at UMass evaluation of program ongoing

Referrals by Referral Point (As of 3/1/2024)





Between CY22 & CY23, referrals increased by 119%




278 Total Referrals

- Judges represented 46% (n=128) of total referrals
- 54% (n=151) of referrals were for persons related offenses
- 55% (n=153) of referrals were from Worcester County

In all three pilot "Learning Lab" sites, referrals increased between CY22 and CY23




Referrals by county (CY22-CY23)


Compared to CY22, both Black and other / multiracial youth represented a larger percent of total intakes






Compared to CY22, girls made up a smaller percent of total intakes

CY23 diversion requirements




Diversion requirements



In CY23, 90% (n=160) of diversion cases closed successfully, up from 74% (n=45) in CY22

What we're hearing in interviews


There is a mismatch between policy and practice across this phase Many people think there needs to be more consistency in condition setting at this stage

Many feel that GPS is not being used appropriately (i.e., reasons & length of time) The "menu" of pretrial options creates confusion and variability in practice across the state

Many feel that 58A hearings are not being used appropriatley This phase can last a long time and may negatively impact the youth



Data Elements For Each Youth Identified

DCF Measures

- Demographics
- Geography
- DCF contact/Case information
- DCF Placement information
- Youth needs, supports and interventions
- Family needs, supports and interventions

DYS Measures

- Demographics
- Geography
- Delinquency case information
- Needs, supports and interventions
- DYS placement information



Case file review

Questions related to the alleged delinquency

- Where, physically, did the arrest take place?
- What were the events leading up to the arrest? Was there any evidence of behavior escalation?
- Is there any documentation that speaks to the decision-making process on why youth were detained (or committed)?

Questions related to the youth's life in recent years

- Were there any other significant life events (good, bad, neutral) in the past year?
- What services/supports was the youth involved in during the past year?
- Is there any evidence this youth experienced challenges in the past year accessing certain services?
- What other state agencies have been involved in the youth's family's life in the past year?


