- Control of most decision points
- Improve outcomes for youth
 - No Criminal Records/Labeling as Defendants
 - Reduce barriers to success
 - Treat Needs
- Reduce recidivism
 - Low-risk youth have higher recidivism rates when involved in the system
- Assess disparities at decision points
- Increase community & victim satisfaction



SCDAO Juvenile Alternative Resolution (JAR)

- Use of Risk/Needs Assessment Tools
- Formalizing with community partners
 - Multi-collaborative approach first of its kind in Massachusetts
- Assess Outcomes
 - Statistical collection and analysis

 - 100+ Data Points Collected for Every JAR Youth







Family Circumstances/Parenting	MODERATE	Inadequate Supervision — Dad doesn't know when he is oftentimes Lives with Dad — Dad as housing court coming up, being evicted → Moving into shelter Dad cannot control or his behavior AT ALL Inappropriate Discipline — Dad is overly permissive and does NOT punish No clear rules in place See's Mom here and there (lives in area) but Mon struggles with alcohol 's brother was murdered in 's Aunt had custody of him until she passed away, then Sister, then Dad. 


BJC Percentage by Age (BJC 2018 N=306)











OYAS Level Across Case Type











First Contact with Juvenile Justice System (N-120)




Close Family Member Ever Been Arrested


