Motion by Cross, seconded by Bain: to accept the minutes from the full Committee meeting on June 13, 2024, as presented.

Review and Act on the following Petition, Jurisdiction and Awaiting Funding List (AFL) Cases

1. JLM-23-10043 Winchester Police DC/GD Vote to a 3(a) Hearing

George Driscoll briefed the Committee and reported that, after several staff mediations and a committee level mediation, the parties could not reach agreement and recommended that the case be voted to a 3(a) hearing.

Motion by Andrews, seconded by Bain: that, in the matter of Winchester Police Patrol Officers Association and Town of Winchester, JLM-23-10043, the issues have remained unresolved for an unreasonable period of time resulting in the apparent exhaustion of the process of collective bargaining, and that the Committee vote to hold a hearing pursuant to Section 1, subsection 3(a) of the Acts of 1987, with panel members consisting of T. Reddy (Labor) and Hayes (Management) or other Committee members and/or senior staff that may be substituted as necessary by the respective Labor and/or Management Chairs pursuant to the rules, policies, and procedures of the Committee, and any other applicable provisions of law, with said panel to be chaired John Hanson.

The Motion passed unanimously.

2. JLM-23-10058 Somerville Patrol DC/GD Vote to a 3(a) Hearing

George Driscoll briefed the Committee and reported that, after staff level mediation and Committee level mediation, the parties could not reach agreement and recommended that the Committee vote the case to a 3(a) hearing.

Motion by Andrews, seconded by Bain: that, in the matter of Somerville Police Employees Association and City of Somerville, JLM-23-10058, the issues have remained unresolved for an unreasonable period of time resulting in the apparent exhaustion of the process of collective bargaining, and that the Committee vote to hold a hearing pursuant to Section 1, subsection 3(a) of the Acts of 1987, with panel members consisting of Andrews (Labor) and Mazzarella (Management) or other Committee members and/or senior staff that may be substituted as necessary by the respective Labor and/or Management Chairs pursuant to the rules, policies, and procedures of the Committee, and any other applicable provisions of law, with said panel to be chaired John Hanson.

The Motion passed unanimously.

3. JLM-23-10181 Worcester Pol. Supervisors RM/JH Vote to Arbitration

Joe Hubley and Robert Markel briefed the committee and, on behalf of the 3(a) hearing panel, recommended that the case be voted to arbitration.

Motion by Andrews, seconded by Bain: to find that in the matter of NAGE/IBPO, Local 504 and the City of Worcester, JLM-23-10181, there is an apparent exhaustion of the processes of collective bargaining which constitutes a potential threat to public welfare and that the Committee vote to send this case to arbitration by a tripartite panel consisting of Alan Andrews or Jim Bartolomei (Labor) and Dean Mazzarella (Management) and/or other Committee members and/or senior staff that may be substituted as necessary by the respective Labor and/or Management Chairs pursuant to the rules, policies, and procedures of the Committee, and any other applicable provisions of law, and a neutral selected in accordance with the Committee's rules, policies and procedures, on an issue by issue basis, with said issues having been identified at the June 13, 2024, hearing held pursuant to Section 1, Subsection 3(a), of Chapter 589 of the Acts of 1987.

The Motion passed unanimously.

4. JLM-23-10316 Somerville Fire GD/JH Vote to 3(a) Hearing

Joe Hubley and George Driscoll briefed the Committee and reported that after staff level mediations and a committee level mediation, the parties could not reach agreement but are continuing to talk. In the meantime, staff and committee members recommend that the case be voted to a 3(a) hearing.

Motion by M. Reddy, seconded by Bain: that, in the matter of Somerville Firefighters, Local 76 and City of Somerville, JLM-23-10316, the issues have remained unresolved for an unreasonable period of time resulting in the apparent exhaustion of the process of collective bargaining, and that the Committee vote to hold a hearing pursuant to Section 1, subsection 3(a) of the Acts of 1987, with panel members consisting of M. Reddy (Labor) and Mazzarella (Management) or other Committee members and/or senior staff that may be substituted as necessary by the respective Labor and/or Management Chairs pursuant to the rules, policies, and procedures of the Committee, and any other applicable provisions of law, with said panel to be chaired John Hanson.

The Motion passed unanimously.

5. JLM-23-10316 Lawrence Supervisors GD/DC Funded/Remove

George Driscoll briefed the Committee and reported that the contract between the parties has been fully ratified and has been funded by the City.

Motion by Andrews, seconded by Bain: to remove the case from the Committee's docket as the contract has been funded by the City.

The Motion passed unanimously.

6. JLM-24-10679 Somerville Supervisors GD/DC Jurisdiction

George Driscoll briefed the Committee and reported that the labor side of the investigation had not been completed.

Motion by Andrews, seconded by Bain: to table this agenda item.

The Motion passed unanimously.
