Mr. Morgado addressed the Committee and stated that the parties only had two meetings. The parties met on May 23 and set ground rules and exchanged proposals. A meeting on June 13 was canceled by agreement of the parties. The parties met again on June 29 and then, on July 5, the union filed the petition. The City objects to jurisdiction on the ground that the collective bargaining process has not been exhausted and they are entitled to a third formal session to exchange proposals. Mayor Mazzarella suggested that the Committee could take jurisdiction but order the parties to have another meeting.

Motion by Keene, seconded by Mazzarella: to take jurisdiction in the case of the Lynn Fire Fighters Union Local 739 IAFF and the City of Lynn, JLM-22-9415, provided that the parties meet for one more formal negotiation session prior to the first mediation session.

Motion by Keene, seconded by Mazzarella: to find that in the matter of the Wayland Firefighters Local 1978 IAFF and the Town of Wayland, JLM-21-8988, that there is an apparent exhaustion of the processes of collective bargaining which constitutes a potential threat to public welfare and that the Committee vote to send this case to arbitration by a tripartite panel consisting of David Keene (Labor) and Mary Aicardi (Management) and/or other Committee members and/or senior staff that may be substituted as necessary by the respective Labor and/or Management Chairs pursuant to the rules, policies, and procedures of the Committee, and any other applicable provisions of law, and Richard Boulanger, chosen by the parties, to serve as chair of the tripartite panel, on an issue by issue basis, with said issues having been identified at the July 18, 2022, hearing held pursuant to Section 1, Subsection 3(a), of Chapter 589 of the Acts of 1987.
