Statement of Intent

I intend to comply with and advance the policy established by this Act.

Statement of Interest

I am a recently retired college professor from Worcester State University. Ph.D. in international diplomatic history (1982). Taught world history, international relations, American and English history, and history of science and technology. Have worked in two corporations. Also worked in the United Nations community during the end of the Cold War. Am deeply concerned about the breakdown of our democratic politics and deep threats to the republic. Am currently studying the history of corporations in the Annals of America - a multivolume collection of documents complementary to the Encyclopedia Britannica. Have read closely and annotated the U.S. Supreme Court case of Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission (2010). The Stevens dissent seems to offer guidance on crafting a U.S. Constitutional amendment to reverse the judgment, but the deeper problem is to resist the Court's tendency to abandon stare decisis (adherence to precedent). The situation is rather like that of the Hughes Court during the New Deal, until Justice Roberts began reversing himself in 1937. The legal view of corporations as "persons" goes way back to Dartmouth College v. Woodward (1819). Any amendment would have to be phrased in expectation of continued corporate existence and even expansion to multinational dimensions. Somehow, in my thinking, the citizen must not be overpowered by the modern corporation. I do not have doctrinaire views. I would like to serve on the commission.


