Overview of the Joseph's Gourmet Pasta (JGP)

Joseph's Gourmet Pasta Company-Haverhill (JGP) is a food manufacturing facility specializing in frozen pasta and sauces for both food service and retail customers located in Haverhill, MA. This facility currently holds Air Quality Plan Approval #MRB-07-IND-015 issued in July 2008.

JGP Facility Proposed Project

The Facility is currently responding to the discontinuation of a key ingredient, reduced wine, by one of its suppliers. As a result, the company is evaluating new methods for preparing wine-based sauce/subs in-house, with a focus on minimizing air emissions of volatile organic compounds (VOCs).

While efforts are being made to reduce VOCs through optimized cooking methods, there may be a need to resume limited on-site wine reduction processes. This would require JGP to revert to a previously slightly higher VOC emissions limit for their facility.

JGP Air Permit Application

JGP has filed an Air Quality Permit Application with the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) for its existing facility. The proposed modification is subject to the Massachusetts Air Pollution Control Regulations (310 CMR 7.00) and must apply for and receive a permit (known as an "Approval") before it can begin construction of the project. MassDEP is currently reviewing the permit application according to the applicable regulations.

MassDEP is currently reviewing this permit application.
