Honorable Chairs and Ranking Minority Members of the Committees on Ways and Means:

Pursuant to Section 6 of Chapter 14 of the General Laws¹, the Department of Revenue (DOR) hereby submits its mid-month tax revenue report for the month of July 2022, the first month of fiscal year 2023. The attached table shows July 2022 month-to-date tax revenue collections through July 15, 2022, along with changes from the equivalent period in July 2021.

Revenue collections are uneven and usually weighted toward month-end, and the brief period covered in the mid-month report does not provide sufficient data for comparison to prior years. Therefore, mid-month figures should not be used to assess trends or project future revenues.

Context for July Revenues

July is typically one of the smaller months for revenue collection, because neither individual nor business taxpayers make significant estimated payments during the month. Historically, roughly 6.7% of annual revenue, on average, has been received during July.

Highlights

Total Tax collections for the month-to-date period were \$898 million, down \$30 million or 3.2% versus the same period in July 2021. The month-to-date decrease is mostly due to decreases in corporate and business tax and all other tax, partially offset by increases in withholding, income estimated and returns payments, and sales tax.

- **Income Taxes** totaled \$658 million, up \$49 million or 8.0% versus the same period in July 2021.
- Sales & Use Taxes totaled \$115 million, up \$12 million or 11.2% versus the same period in July 2021.
- **Corporate & Business Taxes** totaled \$66 million, down \$69 million or 50.9% versus the same period in July 2021.
- **Other Taxes** totaled \$59 million, down \$22 million or 26.6% versus the same period in July 2021.

Details

Total Income Tax of \$658 million for mid-month July is comprised of the following:

- Withholding of \$598 million, up \$32 million versus the same period in July 2021.
- Estimated Payments of \$34 million, up \$10 million versus the same period in July 2021.
- **Returns/Bills** of \$28 million, up \$7 million versus the same period in July 2021.
- **Refunds** of \$2 million, virtually equal to the same period in July 2021.

Sales & Use Tax of \$115 million, up \$12 million versus the same period in July 2021. Typically, only a small proportion of expected regular sales and meals tax remittances is received by the mid-month-date. The month-to-date sales and use tax of \$115 million is comprised of the following:

- \$66 million in regular sales tax collections, up \$6 million versus the same period in July 2021.
- \$18 million in meals tax collections, up \$4 million versus the same period in July 2021.
- \$31 million in motor vehicle sales tax collections, up \$1 million versus the same period in July 2021.

Corporate & Business Tax of \$66 million, down \$69 million versus the same period in July 2021. The month-to-date decrease mostly reflects decreases in corporate and business estimated and return payments.

Other Taxes of \$59 million, down \$22 million versus the same period in July 2021, includes a number of tax categories such as motor fuels, cigarettes, estate taxes, room occupancy, deeds, and others.
