Board Business:

At approximately 10:00 a.m., a quorum was present. Acting Chairperson Koulouris called the meeting of the CRRB to order.

Approval of April 26, 2018 CRRB Meeting Open Session Minutes:

After reviewing the open meeting minutes from the April 26, 2018 CRRB meeting, George Klier made a motion to accept the minutes. Captain Rebeiro seconded the motion. The motion passed by a majority vote of 6-0, with Les Gosule, Maura Dupray, Stephanie Ross, Gloria Moroney, and Jen Romeo-Porcaro abstaining from voting.

Update on Criminal Justice Reform Bill

Acting Chairperson Koulouris gave the Board an update on Chapter 69 of the Acts of 2018, the Criminal Justice Reform Bill and its impact on the Board and DCJIS regulations. Acting Chairperson Koulouris advised the Board that the amendments discussed at the previous meeting were not finalized but, would likely be delivered to Board members within the next few months. The proposed amendments would be discussed at another meeting.

Executive Session:

At this point in the meeting, Acting Chairperson Koulouris indicated the Board would be entering into Executive Session to review CORI complaints whose subject matter is protected pursuant to M.G.L. c. 30A, § 21(a)(7) and M.G.L. c. 6, §172. A motion to enter executive session was made by George Klier and seconded by Stephanie Ross. A roll-call vote was taken, and the motion passed 11-0 with Acting Chairperson Koulouris abstaining from voting. The Board entered executive session at 10:10 a.m.

At the end of all discussion, Acting Chairperson Koulouris indicated that the Board should exit Executive Session. George Klier made a motion to exit executive session. Maura Dupray seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously 11-0. The executive session ended at approximately 11:45 a.m. Thomas Capasso then made a motion to adjourn. Les Gosule seconded the motion and it passed unanimously 11-0. The meeting adjourned at approximately 11:50 a.m.
