Chair Fagan called the meeting to order at 7:01am with Roll Call: Christine Fagan, present: Greg Dorrance, present: Joseph Carvalho, present.

MINUTES:

MOTION made by Greg Dorrance to accept the minutes of the May 20, 2026 meeting. Seconded: Joseph Carvalho. No further discussion, motion passes via roll call unanimously, 3-0.

JOB DESCRIPTION FOR HEAVY EQUIPMENT OPERATOR:

Superintendent Matton stated she is still working with HRD to create the requisition and asset questions for posting.

FY26 BUDGET REVIEW:

Superintendent Matton provided the Commissioners with BCMCP's budget breakdown to date. Commissioner Dorrance was pleased with the current state of the budget and happy with the Superintendent's job handling the finances. An updated breakdown will be provided at the next meeting with both FY26 and the beginning of FY27.

IT MIGRATION TO STATE SERVICE:

Superintendent Matton updated the Commissioners on the progress of new wiring in the walls, cabinet and switch in the MDF room. The state and 3rd party vendors are conducting all the work and cellular back up for cloud and additional equipment is needed. There is an unknown date of transfer as new desktops and laptops must be installed before moving to the state cloud service. This has not been a smooth transition and conducting this work during the busy season has been difficult on the Project.

FIELD UPDATE:

Entomologist Todd Duval continues to provide his weekly report via email. The weekly request call log was provided with comparison to 2024 and 2025. Drought conditions continue but small rain events are creating Culex habitat. Increased temperatures decrease the larval development time, and mosquitoes can emerge quickly after rain events.

Residential requests began on June 1st and calls are up about 40% compared to last year. Adulticiding began on Monday June 8, 2026. Hand larviciding continues, with a focus on residential requests. Catch basin applications will begin next week.

NEW BUSINESS:

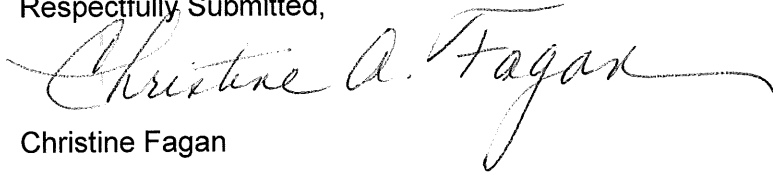
Superintendent Matton provided the date of the next State Reclamation on Mosquito Control Board meeting on June 25, 2026, at 1pm.
