Statement of Interest	My interest in serving on the Massachusetts Citizens Commission is driven by a deep belief that the 2010 Citizens United decision, and the glut of corporate money it has introduced into American elections, has undermined the American principle of a government of the people, by the people, and for the people. My academic and professional experience, including the past four years working on Amazon's artificially intelligent assistant Alexa, has convinced me that the inalienable rights afforded American citizens by the Constitution must not be extended to artificial entities.	
	Massachusetts has a proud history of supporting amendments to the Constitution which have furthered the American ideals of justice and democracy. Massachusetts Senator Charles Sumner advocated for an explicit expansion of the rights provided to former slaves during the drafting of the 13th, 14th, and 15th Amendment, which were not afforded to African Americans until the 1965 enactment of the Voting Rights Act. Massachusetts was also the eighth state to ratify the 19th Amendment, which granted women the right to vote. The Commonwealth has the opportunity to lead the nation once again in the establishment and
