

# Lake Lashaway, East Brookfield

#### **General Information**

Lake Lashaway is a 285- acre warm water pond located just north of Route 9 in the center of East Brookfield. The water is brown in color with a transparency of ten feet. It has an average depth of 12 feet and a maximum depth of 24 feet. The shoreline is 90% developed with year round homes and cottages.

#### **Recreational Access**

Boat access is through a paved Public Access Board located off of Shore Road on the north end of the lake (72°2'29.68"W, 42°14'37.97"N). It is suitable for launching cartop boats and light trailered craft. Parking is available at the ramp for about 6 cars and trailers. Shore access is limited to the area adjacent to the ramp and along Route 9. Please contact MassWildlife for additional information, fee structure, and/or restrictions pertaining to public access of Lake Lashaway.

# **Fish Populations**

The following fish species were found during MassWildlife surveys: Largemouth Bass, Smallmouth Bass, Chain Pickerel, Yellow Perch, White Perch, Black Crappie, Brown Bullhead, Yellow Bullhead, Bluegill, Pumpkinseed, White Sucker, Fallfish, and Golden Shiner.

### **Fishing**

Lake Lashaway offers good fishing for a variety of warm water fish species. The Largemouth Bass and Chain Pickerel are both numerous, with many fish of good size. Panfish are very abundant, and good-sized Bullheads, Yellow Perch and White Perch were common in our surveys. The pickerel population makes this a good bet for ice fishing. Lake Lashaway has produced Largemouth Bass, Smallmouth Bass, Black Crappie, Chain Pickerel, White Perch, and Sunfish that meet the minimum requirements for the Sportfishing Awards program.
