Lake Park Site Improvements (Worcester, MA) 25% Design Development Public Meeting

The Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) is presenting the 25% design development progress for the Lake Park Site Improvements project. The primary motivation for this project is to permanently close the inaccessible swimming beach along Lake Quinsigamond and replace it with a safer, reimagined lakefront overlook experience. Water-based recreation will be redirected to a new spray deck designed specifically for safe and family-friendly play. Universal accessibility and overall site improvements are also included. Lake Park is located within the city of Worcester between Lake Quinsigamond and Lake Ave.

The public will be invited to provide comments during the meeting, after the presentation, by unmuting their microphones, or the chat functionality that will be available through the virtual participation platform.
