


Project Goals

- 6. Unify site furnishings.






















Moody Street Area






Head Raceway Area









- 3. Provides Pollinator Habitat for Insects and Birds.







Construction Process & Timeline

- Construction Fence & Tree Protection Installed Footbridge remains open (Late Fall 2025)
- Work Begins-Site Demolition & Preparation (Fall 2025- Winter 2026)
- Full Site Closure (Early Spring 2026)
- Completion (Summer 2026)
