The Visitor Center is located in a former boardinghouse (1848) of the Bay State Mills, the first textile mill to produce cloth in Lawrence, MA. Find a model of the original interior in the exhibit on the first floor. All ages and abilities are welcome!

Named after Thelma Alice Todd (1906—1935), a Hollywood Actress born in Lawrence, MA, who appeared in over 100 feature films and movie shorts from 1926-1935.
