COUNTDOWN TO 100 LEED CERTIFICATIONS

Since 2007, all new construction at state-owned facilities are required to meet the Massachusetts LEED Plus standard, which requires buildings to achieve both LEED certification and be designed to meet energy performance that is 20% better than the existing Massachusetts building energy code. Since that time, 100 buildings have been constructed that prioritize green building elements such as energy and water efficiency, sustainable materials, and innovative design. This poster highlights the 92nd building to be certified in the state-owned building portfolio.

Located in one of Massachusett's 26 Gateway cities, this state-of-theart LEED platinum building provides services for the Superior, District, Probate & Family, Juvenile, and Housing Courts of Middlesex County. Key design elements contributing to the certification include:



48% improvement over baseline building energy performance



100% reduction in potable landscape water use



Access to public transport, bicycle storage & parking for low-emitting vehicles



Construction utilized low-emitting paints, adhesives & flooring systems



75% diversion of construction & demolition debris
