## DECISION

CONVENIENCE +, INC. DBA CONVENIENCE PLUS #5

241 MAIN STREET LEE, MA 01238

Convenience +, Inc. dba Convenience Plus #5 (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, July 8, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Kujawski's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Kujawski's Compliance Check Field Report dated March 6, 2014; and
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

## **FACTS**

- 1. On Thursday, March 6, 2014, at approximately 4:26 p.m., Investigators Keefe and Kujawski conducted an investigation of the business operation of Convenience +, Inc. dba Convenience Plus #5.
- 2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage, a twelve ounce (12 oz.) can of Coors Light beer for one dollar and thirty five cents (\$1.35). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

## **CONCLUSION**

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 - Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. As the licensee has been in business for more than ten (10) years and has had no previous violations, the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
