**DECISION**

**LOCKER ROOM ENTERPRISES, INC. DBA LOCKER ROOM SPORTS BAR**  
**232 MAIN STREET**  
**LEE, MA 01238**

Locker Room Enterprises, Inc. dba Locker Room Sports Bar (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, July 22, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Kujawski's Report.

2. Investigator Kujawski's Compliance Check Field Report dated March 6, 2014; and


**FACTS**


1. On Thursday, March 6, 2014, at approximately 4:39 p.m., Investigators Keefe and Kujawski conducted an investigation of the business operation of Locker Room Enterprises, Inc. dba Locker Room Sports Bar.
2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage, a bottle of Budweiser Light beer for three dollars and twenty-five cents (\$3.25). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

### CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 - Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
