Il Camino Restaurant Inc. (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, July 14, 2015, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Doyle's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Doyle's Compliance Check Field Report dated May 7, 2015; and
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
- A. Licensee's Overview.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS

- 1. On Thursday, May 7, 2015, at approximately 7:37 p.m., Investigators Bailey and Doyle conducted an investigation of the business operation of Il Camino Restaurant Inc.
- 2. While on the licensed premises an underage operative working with investigators purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, a bottle of Budweiser Light beer, for four dollars and twenty-five cents (\$4.25). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. As the licensee has been in business for over thirty (30) years and has had no previous violations in almost twenty (20) years, the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
