The National Animal Cruelty Investigations School offers a combination of specialized veterinary and lawen forcement training. Students from a range of backgrounds—including federal, state and local animal cruelty officers, humanesociety investigators and board members, police officers and sheriffs' deputies, court personnel and other citizens—learn from experts about all aspects of animal welfare and safety.

Ournationallyrecognizedfacultyoflawenforcement, veterinary and animal health experts teach a systematic approach to animal cruelty investigations. Classes are held allower the United States. The program has three different components that should be taken in order; requests to take the mout of order will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Each component is composed of a 5-day, 40-hour course conducted from 7:30 a.m. to 5p.m. Monday through Thursday. Friday's course will also be gin at 7:30 a.m., but concludes ome time in the afternoon. After completion of all three components (120 hours), you will be a certified humane investigator.
