## CONSENT AGREEMENT FOR REPRIMAND

The Massachusetts Board of Registration in Pharmacy (Board) and Lindsey A. Cincotta (Registrant), a Pharmacy Technician licensed by the Board, Registration No. PT13747, do hereby stipulate and agree that the following information shall be entered into and become a permanent part of the Registrant's record maintained by the Board:

- 1. The Registrant acknowledges that a complaint has been filed with the Board against her Massachusetts Pharmacy Technician registration (registration<sup>1</sup>) related to the conduct set forth in paragraph 2, identified as Docket No. PHA-2012-0044 (the Complaint).
- 2. The Registrant admits that she requested and obtained from a pharmacist at her place of employment, two Schedule VI prescription medications for use by family members without presenting a current, valid prescription for those medications. The Registrant acknowledges that the foregoing facts warrant disciplinary action by the Board under Mass. General Laws., ch. 42A and 61, and under 247 CMR 10.03(1)(a), (e) and (v).
- 3. The Registrant agrees that the Board shall impose a REPRIMAND on her license based on her registration based on the facts admitted in Paragraph 2, effective as of the date on which the Board signs this Agreement (Effective Date).
- 4. The Board agrees that in return for the Registrant's execution and successful compliance with all the requirements of this Agreement, the Board will not prosecute the Complaint.
- 5. The Registrant understands that she has a right to formal adjudicatory hearing concerning the Complaint and that during said adjudication she would possess the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses, to call witnesses, to present evidence, to testify on her own behalf, to contest the allegations, to present oral argument, to appeal to the courts, and all other rights as set forth in the Massachusetts Administrative Procedures Act, G. L. c. 30A, and the Standard Adjudicatory Rules of Practice and Procedure, 801 CMR 1.01 et seq. The Registrant further understands that by executing this Agreement she is knowingly and voluntarily waiving her right to a formal adjudication of the Complaint.
- 6. The Registrant acknowledges that she has been at all times free to seek and use legal counsel in connection with the Complaint and this Agreement.

- The Registrant acknowledges that after the Effective Date, the Agreement constitutes a 7. public record of disciplinary action by the Board subject to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Public Records Law, G.L. ch. 4, §7. The Board may forward a copy of this Agreement to other licensing boards, law enforcement entities, and other individuals or entities as required or permitted by law.
- The Registrant certifies that she has read this Agreement. The Registrant understands and 8. agrees that entering into this Agreement is a voluntary and final act and not subject to reconsideration, appeal or judicial review.
