

Section 4 of Chapter 219 of the Acts of 2016 directed the Supplier Diversity Office (SDO), in consultation with the Massachusetts Office on Disability (MOD), to provide opportunities for individuals with disabilities in all areas of state procurement and contracting.

 Focused on the inclusion of businesses owned by diverse individuals, primarily disability-owned and service-disabled –veteran-owned business enterprises

## and

 Allowed the SDO to encourage contractors and subcontractors to identify, recruit, and hire qualified individuals with disabilities

## **Achieving Pilot Goals**

- Established dedicated staff
  - Program Intern and Program Coordinator
- Vendor workforce initiative
  - Requires annual reporting on disability employment metrics from contractors/ subcontractors on 3 statewide contracts
- Biennial goal expansion
  - Website creation and development
- Ongoing outreach and collaboration with state agencies and community partners
  - Connecting with Disability-Owned Business Enterprises (DOBEs), Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Businesses (SDVOBEs), and other minority businesses to encourage certification and provide resources and support




Collaborate with Massachusetts Office on Disability (MOD) to establish program policy and guidelines
