DECISION

HACHAM'S STORE, INC. DBA THE LITTLE STORE
547 BOSTON POST ROAD

Hacham's Store, Inc. dba The Little Store (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, October 29, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Bailey's Report.

1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and
2. Investigator Bailey's Compliance Check Field Report dated June 17, 2013.


FACTS


1. On Monday, June 17, 2013, at approximately 6:39 p.m., Investigators Doyle and Bailey conducted an investigation of the business operation of Hacham's Store, Inc. dba The Little Store.
2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage, a twenty-four ounce (24 oz.) container of Budweiser Light beer for two dollars and ninety-nine cents (\$2.99). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. As the licensee has had no previous violations the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
