## Statewide Trails Database: Aggregating and Standardizing MA RPA Trails Data (3:15PM)

- Introduction to an ongoing conversation
- Challenge: atomized sources and formats for MA trails data
  - Lots of different public agencies, tough to get a picture of the full truth which can make access and equity difficult
    - Solution: standardizing and publishing in useful ways
  - MassTrails grant working with funding for the last three years
  - How can MARTAB get involved?
  - Work so far:
    - Data Standard Interviews
    - Trails Data Survey + Workshop
    - Existing Trails Data Review
    - Statewide trails data use cases
      - Analysis
      - Advocacy
      - Apps and maps
    - Preliminary data standard
      - Envisioning that RPAs can further develop this for specific uses
- Next steps
  - Trails data management
  - Publish and utilize trails data
    - Working with MassGIS, developing a website (inspiration from the Washington State Trails Data Explorer
- How might MARTAB get involved?

- Advising/feedback
- Governance/participation working group? Outlook group?
- Marianne Iarossi thinks it would be great to see more standardized data especially mobile-friendly interfaces
- Question from Liz:
  - Has MAPC looked at MCRT? Have worked on mapping the trail.
    - Stephen: looked at the progress reports from the organization
      - Use cases on gaps
      - One of the precedent websites
      - Would love to content with them
        - The person is Ben Bayes, and Craig della Penna can connect MAPC to others
- Question from Miriam:
  - Works with asset inventory can MAPC explain more on what they do?
    - Stephen: tough to allocate for funding if we don't have the numbers to back it up
    - Volunteerism and stewardship data
      - Example: street tree censuses can show how much money this saves the city, how much carbon dioxide is captured
        - Marianne points out that we could do something like this with how much carbon dioxide we can avoid emitting with commuter cyclists
        - o Colorado has an impact app crowdsourced with training required
        - o Meg says that there's a gap in accessibility data in existing systems
          - Sometimes crowdsourcing leads to inaccuracies, especially for accessibility (since many people don't understands the entirety of what accessibility is)
      - MAPC is not there yet
        - o Identifying gaps can start a campaign to get this addressed
        - WA deputized different agencies
- Question from Larry: are you working with MassDCR? Facilities data?
  - Using commonwealth data (bike, bed, etc)
    - Linear referencing
    - Facilities inventory
- Opportunity to have Stephen come back for updates
  - $\circ\quad$  Look at the WA trails website and submit feedback if you have it
