

Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes February 10, 2021 | 1:00 PM – 3:00 PM

Due to Covid-19 Social Distancing restrictions, this open meeting was held virtually over the ZOOM platform.

A PowerPoint presentation was shown over ZOOM to all attendees.

#### I. Staffing Update

Sheri stated that the Fund hired Kyle Baron as the new Community Liaison. The Community Liaison is a full-time employee (FTE). Kyle started with the Fund on 1/19/2021.

#### II. Fund Totals and Expenditures

Sheri explained the current Fund's revenue totals. The fund has an unexpended balance of \$294,675 as of 2/2/2021. The total intake for donations in 2020 was \$370,826. This is the highest tax donation season for a calendar year to date. Revenue for CY21 is \$3,002 Numbers reflect that CY20 was up \$28,293 from CY19. To date, the Fund has taken in \$2,844,669 in revenue. \$2,388,381 (84%) has been from tax donations, \$104,259 (4%) from online donations and grants, \$2,028. from Interest, and \$350,000 (12%) from line items on the state budget.

Sheri explained the Fund's current balance sheet that illustrated all income and expenditures of the Mass Animal Fund since 2017. The balance sheet also contains the proposed spending for CY21. In CY20 the Fund received a total of \$370,826 in revenue and has spent \$288,233 The CY20 spending was in the following allocations: 41% for veterinary services, less than 1% for ACO training, 36% for administration, less than 1% for marketing and 22% went into surplus. Laura asked why the Fund had a surplus in 2020. Sheri stated that the Fund spent less than proposed in the CY20 budget

for veterinary due to the Covid-19 pandemic and reduced surgery capacity. Sheri proposed that the entire 2020 surplus be allocated for veterinary expenses in 2021. The Advisory Committee agreed to put the CY20 surplus into the veterinary allocation for CY21. The accepted CY21 budget of \$512,000 for the Fund has the following allocations: 65% (\$332,000) for veterinary, <1% (\$23,250) for ACO training, 30% (\$154,000) for administration. Sheri stated the CY21 budget will get reevaluated after the tax season if the donation goal is not met.

To date (from start of the program) the Fund's spending was in the following distributions: \$1,742,021 (61%) for veterinary services, \$86,118 (3%) for ACO training, \$691,183 (24%) for administration, \$23,327 (<1%) for marketing, and \$301,992 (11%) surplus.

#### III. BUDGET LINE ITEM

The Fund received \$50,000 in additional funding from a line item in the Massachusetts FY21 budget. In January the Fund started utilizing the line item and has spent \$30,605 to date.

#### IV. SPAY/NEUTER VOUCHER PROGRAM

Sheri presented the Spay/Neuter Voucher Program numbers. In CY20, \$169,460 was issued for spay/neuter to help 1067 dogs and cats. In 2020, the Fund has issued 1772 vouchers. Voucher distribution increased in the second half of 2020 as surgery capacity increased. Since the Voucher Program's inception in 2014, the Fund has spent \$1,764,365 to help 13,600 Commonwealth cats/dogs.

As of February 10, 2021, the voucher waitlist is 129 animals, equaling \$20,250 in assistance, this is down from over 800 waiting in April/May. There are currently 445 unexpired vouchers outstanding equaling \$78,915, an additional 626 vouchers were issued in 2020 expired totaling \$90,450 which is roughly a 50% unused rate. The voucher distribution rate is currently 40 vouchers a week, up from 10 during the height of the Covid-19 restrictions.

The Fund received a grant from the Community Foundation of North Central Massachusetts for \$8,050 which was fully spent to help over 50 animals at 2 clinics hosted by Animal Shelter Inc. Clinic in Sterling. The Fund also received a \$3,000 donation from the Shirley Windsor Charitable Trust.

Sheri stated the Fund currently has 10 Voucher Days scheduled this Spring and is planning to schedule more into the Summer.

The Fund reviewed the current spay/neuter voucher reimbursement rates. Sheri stated that a survey was sent out to all current MAF veterinary providers but that only a portion of responses was received. Breakdowns of the current 4 tier rate structure and what tiers were not meeting provider costs were given. Please see pages 14 through 22 of the attached PDF presentation.

Sheri told the AC that to update rates in contract renewals, the rates need to be set at the next AC meeting in April. Martha asked if there was a cost of care calculator that could be used to help standardize provider input. Sheri did not know of one but will research. Laura asked if there was a noticeable geographical difference in cost for providers. Sheri responded that the cost seemed more varied by nonprofit/private practice. Ray suggested we consider a stipend for areas of low

participation. Sheri asked that consideration be given to having separate cat/dog tiers and possibly unbundling vaccines and additional services. Ray asked for numbers to be presented on what the surgeries performed in 2019 and 2020 would cost at proposed changes. David asked for thoughts on the reputation of the voucher program. The Committee felt that we need to make sure we are trying to meet the veterinary cost of care whenever possible and agreed to discuss reimbursement rates in depth at our next meeting. Sheri will be work on proposals and gathering data.

#### V. PROMOTIONS/EVENTS

Sheri stated that the Fund will have 2021 tax season billboards, thanks to the partnership with MassDOT.

The Fund will also be running many 2021 tax donation social posts. It is uncertain if any in-person promotional events will be scheduled due to the ongoing pandemic.

#### VI. ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER PROGRAM UPDATES

Sheri proposed that the 2020 Core Competencies Training be postponed until the Fall of 2021 due to the ongoing pandemic. The AC agreed.

Sheri reported that in the next Core Training cycle, 8 ACOs need to retake the training, and 63 ACOs need to take the Core for the first time. Roughly half of the ACOs that need to take the Core for the first time are ACOs that have been employed in the field for less than 18 months.

Sheri reported that the 2021 ACO designations and ACO CE letters that were scheduled to be mailed at the end of December were delayed due to an unexpected medical leave. 2021 Designations were mailed at the end of January 2021 and ACO CE letters will go out in the next month.

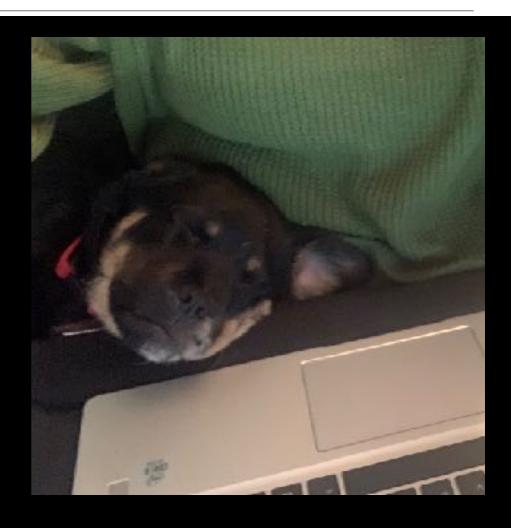

### **Provider Reimbursement Rate Review**

The following Tier system shall be followed for reimbursement of the Contractor:

Tier I	Cat neuter	\$75
Tier II	Cat spay/small dog (<50lbs.) neuter	\$150
Tier III	Small dog (<50lbs.)Spay/ Large dog neuter (>50lbs.)	\$225
Tier IV	Big dog (>50 lbs.) spay	\$300

The Municipality ("Contractor") shall coordinate with licensed veterinarians to perform the following services for cats/dogs under the Program: DHPP/FVRCP and rabies vaccines, anesthesia and pain management medications, spay/neuter surgery, IV fluids (if necessary), blood tests (if necessary), additional medications (if necessary), and additional supplies or services (if necessary);

### **Additional Charges**

A municipality may ask for a next tier reimbursement for pyometra surgery. In the case of a cat/small dog (<50lbs.) with pyometra, municipality may ask for a reimbursement rate of \$300. In the case of a big dog (>50lbs.) with pyometra, municipality may ask for a reimbursement rate of \$450.

A municipality may ask for a next tier reimbursement for a dystocia/spay surgery. Please note a spay must be performed at the time of surgery to be eligible for reimbursement. In the case of a cat/small dog (<50lbs.) with dystocia, municipality may ask for a reimbursement rate of \$300. In the case of a big dog (>50lbs.) with dystocia, municipality may ask for a reimbursement rate of \$450.

A municipality may ask for the equivalent spay reimbursement amount for abdominal cryptorchid males. In the case of an abdominal cryptorchid male cat, municipality may ask for the reimbursement rate of \$150. In the case of an abdominal cryptorchid male dog (<50 lbs.), municipalities may ask for \$225. In the case of an abdominal cryptorchid male dog (>50 lbs.), municipality may ask for \$300.

### **Additional Charges**

A municipality may ask for additional reimbursements for the following complications, limit 1 per surgery:

- Inguinal cryptorchid additional \$25 reimbursement
- Older than 5 years (if additional bloodwork is deemed necessary) additional \$25 reimbursement
- 3. Extra Large (+100 lbs.) additional \$25 reimbursement
- 4. Estrus additional \$25 reimbursement
- Obese (must state body condition score) additional \$25 reimbursement
- 6. Parasite treatment for active infestation additional \$10 reimbursement.
