





- The Mass Central Rail Trail (MCRT) is an envisioned 104-mile off-road shared-use trail connecting Boston to Northampton along the former Central Massachusetts Railroad corridor.
- Today, approximately 50 miles of the vision have been realized as fully developed rail trail.







- The MCRT "Wayside" refers to the 23-mile section of the MCRT from Waltham to Berlin.
- This segment of rail corridor is owned by the MBTA and DCR holds a lease that grants it rights to build, manage, and maintain a shared-use path within a 19-foot right of way, along with associated amenities.








- In 2019 a 5-mile segment of the MCRT Wayside opened in Weston and Wayland.
- Work is currently underway to extend that trail to the west through Wayland, Sudbury, and Hudson.








- The City of Waltham is currently building the Wayside trail from Route 117 east to Beaver Street.
- The Waltham to Weston segment in question is an approximately 0.5-mile connection between those two parts of the Wayside trail.








Project Goals

- Connect the segments of the MCRT that are complete or under construction
- Support enhanced access to recreation, transit, jobs, and retail
- Create a high-quality user experience in a complex area where the trail users will interact with significant roadway infrastructure
- Rehabilitate existing bridges
- Protect and preserve sensitive habitat and cultural/historical assets














































Rest Area at Truss Bridge










Allee at Midway








Bridge over MBTA








Bridge over I-95



Blackstone River Greenway








MCRT Over I-95
