My name is Karen Scalia from Shields Health Care Group and thank you for the opportunity to share my concerns with the Department of Public Health about Mass General Brigham's community expansion plans and intent to establish an outpatient center in Woburn. I am a lifelong resident of Massachusetts and currently hold the position of Vice President of Safety and Quality at Shields Health Care Group. I have been in healthcare for over 40 years serving in various clinical and leadership roles. As I am affiliated with a safety net healthcare provider, I have serious concerns about how Mass General Brigham's proposed expansion will impact health equity and the cost of care.

My concern is that Mass General Brigham's expansion into Woburn, is <u>likely to worsen existing health disparities</u>. Due to the economic impact of the pandemic, many Massachusetts families and individuals are struggling to make ends meet. Any increases to the cost of care are unacceptable. The proposed MGB sites target higher income, commercially insured populations that are already served well by high quality and expert existing providers. These locations are not easily accessible to residents of low-income communities with barriers to health care, leaving access and the needs of many residents behind. MGB will be drawing commercially insured patients away from local providers who rely on that care to subsidize patients that are insured by public programs, such as Medicare or Medicaid, or who are uninsured. Our local providers will continue to provide high quality patient focused care while serving those patients even if their commercial volume is negatively impacted by MGB. Dear Commissioner Bharel,

We write to share our concerns regarding the proposed expansion of Massachusetts General Brigham (MGB) into Woburn. [DoN – Mass General Brigham Incorporated – Multisite – 21012113-AS)]. We have read the application, and while the applicant asserts the new project will bring costs down and increase access to care, it is unclear to us this will be so. We applaud the Department's efforts to require an independent cost analysis, and we hope the cost analysis and subsequent policy decisions will consider the following concerns:-

- Cost of Care Massachusetts in recent years has sought a concerted shift in the locus of care: out from high-priced hospitals and back into the community, yielding lower prices while maintaining quality. On the surface, the application proposes to fit that policy framework; however, we worry the application has distorted the frame. It appears the applicant refers to savings based on its existing top-of-the-market price tags, not on the typical costs for care in our community. Further, as the applicant gains patients and offers care to new clients in the region, will patients really be paying less? We worry the proposed expansion may in fact increase costs of care; as MGB expands into Woburn, and siphons patients from existing providers, MGB's market presence may further increase, reducing competition and making it more difficult for other participants in the health care marketplace to keep costs down.
- Access to Care MGB's application contends it will increase access to care by bringing care out
 from Boston and back into the community. Of course, our community already is served by highquality community institutions and health care providers. Moreover, we fear MGB's application
 fails to account for the impact of this expansion on existing providers and their patient bases.
 Existing community providers, including many now accessible by bus and other public

transportation, serve public pay populations and rely on commercially insured patients to make ends meet. MGB's expansion threatens to attract commercially-insured patients from our local providers. While existing community providers will strive to continue to serve vulnerable patients, they may be financially forced to close needed medical services if the market share of commercially insured patients migrates to MGB. Expansion of MGB must come neither at the expense of our local institutions and essential local jobs, nor access to care for our least fortunate.

The Determination of Need process exists to encourage competition with a public health focus; to promote population health; to support the development of innovative health delivery methods and population health strategies within the health care delivery system; and to ensure resources will be made reasonably and equitably available to every person within the Commonwealth at the lowest reasonable aggregate cost. If we are to contain costs, improve public health outcomes, and transform how we deliver care, we must ensure we make care accessible and deliver it in the most cost-effective way. We worry the proposed expansion of MGB into Woburn threatens the goals of the Determination of Need program, and we encourage your careful review of the application and the potential impacts on our local institutions and providers and the communities they serve.
