

ABOUT MCB

As established in M.G.L. c.6, s. 133, (1) "Blind persons", a person who, after examination by a physician or by an optometrist, whichever such person shall select, has been determined to have (a) not more than 20/200 central visual acuity in the better eye with correcting lenses, or (b) an equally disabling loss of the visual field as evidenced by a limitation to the field of vision in the better eye to such a degree that its widest diameter subtends an angle of no greater than 20 degrees.

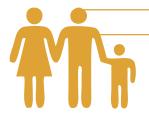

State Facts

MCB averages 2,000 new consumer registrations annually.

Key Services

MCB has two main programs: Vocational Rehabilitation and Social Rehabilitation.

Vocational Rehabilitation services assist older students and adults to prepare for, achieve, retain, or regain employment. This includes the Randolph Sheppard Vocational Rehabilitation program which prepares individuals who are legally blind for a career in concession management.

Social Rehabilitation services assist in the adjustment to blindness and support maximum personal independence and living in community. These services are targeted to children 0-13 and seniors. These include

- Deaf-Blind Extended supports (DBES)
- Children Services including case management, referrals, funding for recreational and support for Individualized Education Plans (IEP).

Additionally, consumers access other unique services including: Certificates of Blindness, MCB Blind Identification cards, referrals for MBTA Blind Access CharlieCard, Specialized Telephone Equipment Program and Disabled Parking Placard/Plate for a vehicle.
