veterans and dependents receive direct financial assistance per month

Over **14,000** disabled veterans, and their loved ones, and gold star parents and wives receive a semi-annual annuity totaling more than **\$28m** per year

Each city and town receives an average quarterly reimbursement totaling over **\$44m** per year

By the end of 2019, approximately **\$10.9m** will be allocated to work with contracted veteran housing providers



109,000

claims are processed per year

More than **24,000** Veterans and eligible dependents receive both annuity and Chapter 115 benefits



With approximately **985** homeless veterans currently in Massachusetts, DVS works with **24** veteran centric housing providers



Since July 2018, the SAVE team has made approximately 5,170 direct contacts, making 1,625 referrals
