Action Plan Purpose and Overview

- Provide comprehensive strategy and framework to achieve Solid Waste Master Plan goal
 - Reduce disposal of food and other organic materials by 350,000 tons annually by 2020.
- Intent is to track status and use as a living document
- First issued February 2012
- Periodic updates since then
- Last update January 2016
- Plan to update again by January 2017

Action Plan Organization

 11 page document – combines text and table with action items

Organized into four primary categories

- o Data Analysis
- Collection Infrastructure
- Processing Capacity/Market Development
- Regulatory Reform/Waste Ban

Action Plan Status

- Almost all action items have been implemented, are ongoing activities, or are underway
- Big picture do not expect to change overall scope of Action Plan
- MassDEP staffing has been reduced
- But have RecyclingWorks in Massachusetts program resources

Action Plan Next Steps

- Review action items in current plan
- Receive feedback on new or modified Action Items
- Prepare updated Action Plan by January 2017
- Continue to assess periodically over time
