Re: MEPA Regulatory Updates

Dear Director Kim:

On behalf of the Massachusetts Port Authority (Massport), we are pleased to have the opportunity to provide comments on the proposed updates to the Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act (MEPA) regulations at 301 CMR 11.00. The proposed updates are part of a larger effort that began in 2021 to update MEPA's Environmental Justice and Climate Adaptation policies and protocols as well as the MEPA regulations. The proposed updates are intended to harmonize existing policies and regulations with current policy and planning efforts to ensure that environmental justice and climate resiliency considerations are more formally incorporated into the statewide environmental review process.

Massport appreciated the opportunity to participate in the MEPA Advisory Committee meetings and previously provided comments related to environmental justice that were the focus of the first phase of this regulatory update process. As part of the second phase of this process, MEPA has proposed administrative updates and changes to its review thresholds. As we noted during the Advisory Committee meetings, the current regulatory definitions for "replacement project" and "routine maintenance" are unclear and would benefit from clarification. We therefore support the proposed revisions to these terms. Massport is also supportive of the revisions intended to support the implementation of ecological restoration projects.

Although Massport requested being including in the formal distribution for proposed projects near Boston Logan International Airport, L.G. Hanscom Field, and the Worcester Regional Airport as a means to protect critical airspace for safety and avoid potential changes to overflight noise impacts, we understand such a change has yet to be adopted. We ask for EEA's consideration of this administrative revision at your earliest convenience.
