ACHIEVEMENTS

- Since 2004, the MSBA has made over \$15.8 billion in payments to cities, towns and regional school districts.
- Currently, there are 321 projects that have received invitations from the Board of Directors to collaborate with the the MSBA and are currently in the MSBA's Eligibility Period and Capital Pipeline.
- The 2022 Statement of Interest (SOI)I submittal period opened on January 28, 2022. The deadline to file for consideration in the Accelerated Repair Program (ARP) was March 25, 2022, while the deadline to file for consideration in the Core Program was April 29, 2022.
- The MSBA received 67 ARP SOIs and 54 Core SOIs for consideration with decisions coming in the late Summer/fall.
